Recommendation/Motion: To approve the naming of the Mary E. Britton Middle School Medical and Health Sciences Room (C111) to the "Baptist Health Lexington Medical and Health Sciences Lab".

Background/Rationale: Mary E. Britton Middle School is committed to preparing students for future success through innovative, real-world learning experiences. The Medical and Health Sciences Room is a dedicated, hands-on instructional space that introduces middle school students to foundational concepts in anatomy, physiology, nutrition, mental health, and healthcare careers. In alignment with national STEM and health education standards, the room serves as a launchpad for student interest in medical and wellness pathways. Naming the lab in honor of Baptist Health Lexington recognizes the organization's longstanding commitment to health, education, and community partnerships. As part of this partnership, Baptist Health Lexington has proposed a financial commitment of \$25,000 over five years to support the purchase of state-of-the-art lab equipment, teacher training, facility enhancements, and student enrichment opportunities. This collaboration will directly impact hundreds of students on an annual basis and will help to cultivate the next generation of healthcare professionals.

I. Executive Summary

This proposal outlines a unique opportunity for Baptist Health System, d.b.a. Baptist Health Lexington/Hamburg to obtain exclusive naming rights to the Health Science Room at Mary E. Britton Middle School, a forward-thinking educational environment that introduces students to the foundations of health and wellness. This partnership will also offer avenues for deeper engagement in shaping the future of healthcare education through mentorship, resources, and career pathway development.

II. Overview of the Health Science Room

The Health Science Room is a dedicated, hands-on learning space designed to introduce middle school students to core concepts in human anatomy, physiology, nutrition, mental health, and healthcare careers. This space serves as a launchpad for student interest in the healthcare field, with interactive tools, lab materials, and digital simulations aligned with national STEM and health education standards.

III. Naming Rights Opportunity

We propose that the Health Science Room be named in honor of Baptist Health for a period of 5 years (with first refusal rights for continuation thereafter), recognizing your commitment to education, health, and the community. This will include:

- Prominent signage outside and within the room (e.g., "The Baptist Health Science Lab")
- Inclusion in promotional materials, newsletters, and media coverage
- Recognition on the school website and at school events
- Dedication ceremony with press and community attendance

IV. Benefits of Partnership

- Enhanced visibility and goodviill within the community
- Opportunity to shape early interest in healthcare careers
- Direct connection with the next generation of healthcare professionals
- Fulfillment of corporate social responsibility and philanthropic goals

- Financial support for technology, equipment, and curriculum enhancements
- Access to real-world insights and mentorship opportunities

V. Additional Collaboration Opportunities

Baptist Lexington/Hamburg would propose to deepen this partnership through:

- Serving as a resource for training/curriculum development for teachers, i.e., biannual or annual meeting(s) with staff to plan for content, trends in job market, new technology, etc.
- -Guest speakers and healthcare career panels
- Hands-on workshops or simulation experiences
- Field trips to healthcare facilities
- Internships or job shadowing opportunities for older students through district partnerships

- Scholarship sponsorships for students pursuing health sciences in high school and beyond
- Co-development of a "Health Careers Week" or similar initiative

VI. Investment and Impact

The proposed investment for naming rights and collaborative programming is twenty-five thousand [\$25,000] over a 5-year term. Funds will be used for:

- State-of-the-art lab equipment and learning materials
- Teacher training and curriculum development
- Facility enhancements
- Transportation and materials for student enrichment activities

This investment will directly impact hundreds of students each year, fostering early interest and proficiency in healthcare-related disciplines.
