
Consists of four domains: reading, listening, speaking, and writing

DISTRICTWIDE | MAY 28, 2025



Students enrolled in a U.S. school for less than 3 years



WHAT'S NEXT-CONTINUOUS GROWTH

Positives

- 1. Attainment rate increased from 5.1% to 5.5%
- District totals show a growth in students exiting the program
- 3. Overall increase in positive growth and decrease in negative growth
- 4. All ELL teachers are certified or in the process of certification (TESOL, ELL endorsement, or Masters in ELL)
- 5. Immersion of ELL students in all schools-showed a successful result
- Focused interventions specific to language acquisition. (Newcomer program and/or Team toolkit)
