

DUAL CREDIT
Memorandum of Agreement

Between
Campbellsville University
and
Bullitt County Public Schools

The purpose of this agreement is to set forth the terms and conditions required to award credit for Campbellsville University dual credit courses successfully completed by high school students attending Bullitt County Public Schools.

This agreement allows students to earn college credit for comparable high school coursework. Upon enrollment at Campbellsville University, a student who has successfully completed one or more dual credit courses will have the option of completing his/her college program in less time. This agreement supersedes any previous dual credit agreement established between Campbellsville University and Bullitt County Public Schools in the same content area. This agreement is exclusive to Bullitt County Public Schools and Campbellsville University, and no assurance is given that courses awarded through this agreement will transfer to any other postsecondary institution.

Authorized dual credit courses and faculty for the 2025-2026 academic year in the content area named above are:

- All General Education courses approved through the KHEAA Dual Credit Scholarship and the KHEAA Work Ready Dual Credit Scholarship.

Campbellsville University is listed as a partnering school in the KHEAA offered Dual Credit Scholarship program for the Academic Year 2025-2026. We are at the agreed tuition rate of under 50% of the KCTCS credit hour rate, which is set by KHEAA and state budget allocations. Students who have previously exhausted their scholarship through another offering will be responsible for the cost of these courses should they decide to enroll with Campbellsville University. Students are also responsible for any books or materials used in the course, as demonstrated by the faculty member.

Financial responsibility for the unsuccessful completion of either course (W/U) will remain with the student. If a student drops this course, it will need to occur by October 1 for the fall term and March 1 for the spring term. Grading procedures will be reflected in the course syllabus provided by the instructor of the specific courses taken by Bullitt County Public School students.
