Opening Business

- d. Good News Report: On 5/22, Kindergarten students celebrated their end of the year with a fun day at the Sports Plex. On 5/23, kindergarten students concluded their year with kindergarten graduation. On 5/28, the staff closed out a successful school year.

School Achievement Report/Data

- a. Student Achievement: Nothing new to report this month.

School Improvement Planning

- a. Monthly Review: The CSIP had a goal of 80% of the students being at or above grade level by the end of the school year in reading, as measured by IReady. 92% of the students were at or above level in reading. The math goal was 70% or more of the students at or above level, measured by IReady. 78% of the students were at or above grade level in math. On May 28, the kindergarten teachers worked on aligning standards and learning targets with the math and reading program. We will continue to work on our school writing plan, PBIS handbook revision and processes, and the MTSS procedures for the upcoming school year.

Budget

- a. Monthly Review: Reviewed the current budget.
- b. Revise 2025-26 Budget: The allocation amount was listed incorrectly on the tentative budget approved in the May meeting. The budget was approved with the correct allocations, with no changes except to the amount in the office supply budget.

Bylaw or Policy Review / Readings / Adoption

- a. 2025 Legislative Updates: Mrs. Kuhn shared information about the following bills and their impact on the schools. The following are bills that are laws and require no SBDM action: SB 19 requires that each school day start with a moment of silence; SB 181 requires school personnel to follow specific board policy when communicating with students. The following bills may impact SBDM and require policy additions or updates: HB 240 focuses on reading plans and retention for students in kindergarten and 1st grade; HB 208 relates to cell phone bans and social media for students; SB 181 related to child sexual abuse curriculum in which the bill includes a provision that allows age-appropriate instruction on child sexual abuse in public schools for all grade levels and this instruction is excluded from the prohibition on human sexuality instruction for younger students.

New Business

- a. Vacancies/Hiring: The hiring of Haleigh Johnson for the teacher position created an IA vacancy. S Taylor and C Kuhn completed interviews and would like to submit the following person for hire: Amy Blankley
