### Learning at Lincoln!

- Our reading series, *Amplify CKLA* is in its fourth year of implementation. Teachers have all needed hard copy materials and access to their online materials. Our dedicated teachers will receive another important literacy training with our TRL Coach, Stefany from *The Reading League* in November. The intentional, virtual coaching gifted to us from TRL will also continue this school year. We have been awarded this coaching for a FIFTH year.
- We are in our fifth full year of implementation of our math series, EnVisions Math.
- All students will be embarking on an intentional Social Emotional Learning journey this school year at Lincoln using our new program, Second Step.

# **Emergency Plan/Drills**

- Every LES Staff member participated in a safety training with Officer Brendel prior within the first days of school. During the training we reviewed all safety and drill procedures.
- All state required emergency drills have been completed with our students (severe weather, lockdown, earthquake, fire, etc.)

#### 21st Century After-School Learning Program

 Our After-school program is up and running already this school year. The program began the fourth day of school and is serving approximately 50 students at this time. They have the capacity to serve 100 of our Lincoln students grades K through now 6<sup>th</sup> grade!

### Attendance! Nine days or less equals success!

- We are starting the year off strong with the continued emphasis on the message about the importance of attending school.
- The Family Resource Center will become apart of our work this year to help families overcome barriers with attendance issues.
- Our classrooms are participating in an Attendance Homeroom Candy Land Game where they are tracking classroom attendance in order to earn incentives.
