Safety

- Each school's emergency response plans, reunification plans, and cardiac emergency response plan (CERP) have been updated for the 2025-2026 school year.
- School principals and assistant principals have reviewed emergency procedures with school staff. The required beginning of the school year drills have been conducted within the timeframe permitted.
- Silco has performed their official inspections of all buildings.

Health Services

School-Based Health Center - HealthPoint Family Care

- HealthPoint is still waiting on approvals from governing agencies in order to confirm a start date. A HealthPoint staff member reported on August 21st that they believe all approvals should be received within the coming weeks and the SBHC should be ready to open in three weeks.
- HealthPoint representatives from their SBHC department/division met with all three school nurses on Monday, July 28th. At that time, HealthPoint toured the nursing facilities at all three of our traditional schools.
- Consent forms for services from the SBHC were included in the beginning of the year packets.

School Nursing

- All school nurses are working diligently on updating school health records.
 Parents/Guardians will be notified by phone and in writing if their child is not in compliance with the regulations.
- School nurses provided training on diapering, toileting, and lifting to all special education health aides in the district on August 13th.
- School nurses launched the new Medication Administration Training for Non-Licensed Personnel for identified staff members. The training modules and assessments were successfully integrated into the existing Vector Solutions platform used by school staff. After passing the written assessment, staff members proceeded to the second phase of training, a skills competency evaluation conducted under the direct supervision of a school nurse. To be authorized to administer medication in the nurse's absence, the staff member must successfully complete both components of the training.
- Big Smiles Dental Clinic will be at Newport Intermediate School September 2nd 5th.
 They will be at Newport Primary School in October.

Student Services

Family and Court Liaison

- Attended the 2025 Alternative Education Summit in Lexington on July 29th and 30th.
 This conference provides support for school personnel working with state agency
