

## **Rationale for AP compared to Dual Credit**

Newport High School, in recent years, has not offered Advanced Placement (AP) courses. Instead, we have focused on dual credit opportunities for our students. Below is a rationale outlining the strong benefits of dual credit options for our students.

## AP:

- 1. Taken on campus.
- 2. Requires teacher certification to teach AP courses (which incurs a financial cost).
- 3. There is a for each test, whether the student passes or fails (\$100).
- 4. Institutions vary in how they articulate a passing score.
- 5. Students must pass a summative exam with a certain score to be eligible for college credit.
- 6. On an honors scale, GPA may receive a small boost for passing the class, even without a passing exam score.
- 7. Students must pass the exam to be college-ready.
- 8. Studies show that urban and high-poverty communities often struggle with standardized tests (KY LRC, 2013).

## **Dual Credit:**

- 1. Typically taken off-campus at a local college. NHS offers Gateway and YSA courses at NKU.
- 2. Students earn both high school and college credits by passing the course. This does not rely on one single measure to receive college benefits.
- 3. A larger variety of class offerings are available.
- 4. Students can follow their specific learning plan while earning college credit.
- 5. Passing the course is considered evidence of being college-ready.
- 6. Students who take dual credit courses are more likely to enter and complete college.
- 7. There is a strong financial benefit for families. NHS students typically graduate with 24 college credit hours—close to a full collegiate year. YSA students have the opportunity to earn an associate's degree.
- 8. Credits are transferable to any state school and most schools in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission (781 schools).

## **Schools Similar to Newport:**

Bellevue - Does not offer AP, Dual credit only.

Dayton - Does not offer AP, dual credit only (ended AP after pass rates were consistently low)

Lloyd (1 Class offered, pass rate not shared)

Holmes - Limited AP offerings. 20% Pass rate
