

Dayton High School Board Report Wednesday, September 24th, 2025



- Homecoming Game was on Friday, September 12th.
 - Homecoming dance was held in the high school cafeteria on Saturday, September 13th.
 - 130 students attended
- School Level Attendance Committee:
 - o Identifying students missing school.
 - Scott Meyers makes daily phone calls for students who are absent and logging contacts in Truancy Tracker – unless a student's parent/guardian has contacted school explaining child's absence from school on that day.
 - o Mr. Haskamp sends out a letter at 3, 6, 8 unexcused absences from school.
 - Once a student reaches 6 unexcused absences, our FRYSC makes a home visit.
 - When a student has 10 unexcused absences, Mr. Haskamp will make a home visit.
 - At 15 unexcused absences, a studetent's name will be turned over to the County Attorney's office.
- 1st Quarter Progress Report Period Ended on Wednesday, September 10th.
 - o Progress Reports went home out of 6th Bell on Friday, September 12th.

- I'MPORTANT Meetings took place at Dayton HS on the following dates:
 - o Tuesday, September 2nd
 - o Tuesday, September 23rd
- We have 15 sophomore students signed up to take the SAT on Saturday, October 4th, at NKU. We worked to get these students registered, waivers to pay for the test, and transportation to the test on the morning of October 4th. These students have been receiving SAT prep via their FLEX courses and are hoping to reach the benchmarks in order to qualify for the YSA program as juniors.
- Update on our current post-secondary readiness numbers:
 - We are now at 28/44 students post-secondary ready for 64%.
 - Ways we are attempting to get students Post-Secondary Ready:
 - Industry Certification and Dual Credit through the ATC. We did not have any students enroll this year with Skilled Trades at Newport HS
 - KYOTE Testing with specific FLEX time interventions.
 - Gateway/Dual Credit students must earn a C or better in their courses.
 - Industry Certifications through our business department pathways at DHS.
 - Juniors at Dayton HS take ACT Test Prep to help prepare them to reach required benchmark scores to achieve Post-Secondary Ready status.
- We will continue to meet as an administrative team regularly to check on progress of students and look for additional ways to support students as they work toward postsecondary readiness.
