

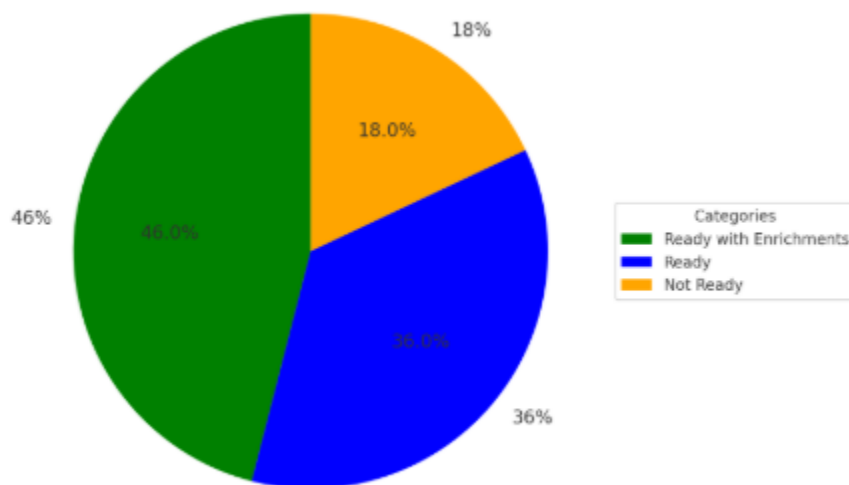


Special Education and Preschool Board Report October 2025

1. Brigance Kindergarten Readiness Assessment has been completed and the students who attended **Southgate Preschool ROCKED it!**

82% of students who attended Southgate Preschool scored Ready for Kindergarten!

Ready w Enrichments + Ready = 82% of Preschool students tested Ready



46% tested Ready with Enrichments – (Scored above Ready)

36% tested Ready

18% tested Not Ready

These scores are a testament to all of the hard work Mrs. Scott, Mrs. Missy and Mrs. Lisa poured into our students last year and testament to our 5-Star Preschool Program!



For Comparison:

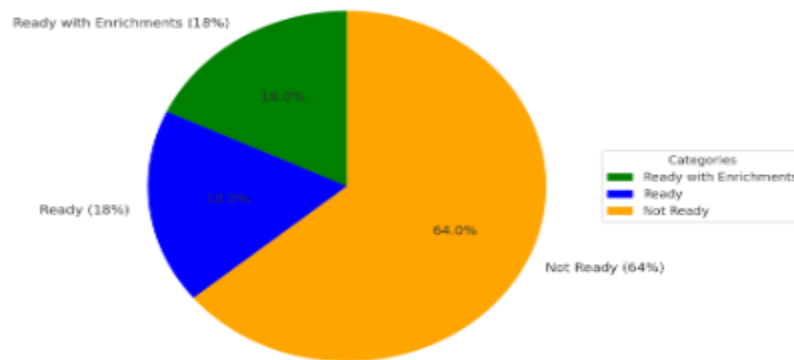
Students who did not attend our Preschool – **only 36% tested Ready for Kindergarten**

64% tested Not Ready



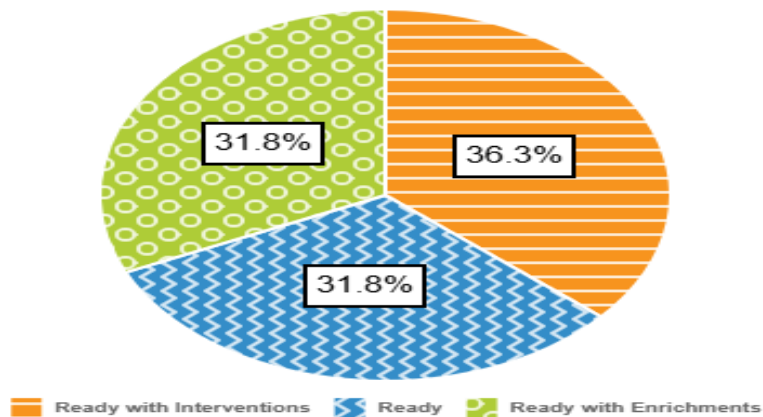
Whole Class Score - 63.3% of the entire Kindergarten Class tested Ready

5. I am going to be working with Mr. Lucas to explore field trip options specific to our MSD students, such as We Rock the Spectrum in Crestview Hills and the new Perspectives for Life Skills in Florence.

NKCES is paying for a membership at Perspectives: Skills for Life for participating districts to be able to use, so there will be no cost to the district other than transportation.
