In collaboration with our Communication Coordinator, Bain Lindeman, we are introducing the WOO Award (Welcoming Outstanding Organizations Award). This initiative aims to highlight and acknowledge businesses and organizations that partner with our school district. We are very excited about these new partnerships and the positive impact they bring to our schools and community.

### **GES - Report provided by Gabby Schwaninger**

In recent weeks, the GES Family Resource Center has been focused on outreach, support, and community engagement. In September, I attended the New Coordinators Orientation to strengthen my knowledge and resources. We're partnering with SPF to coordinate Red Ribbon Week activities at Grandview, while taking the lead on organizing the event at Southgate. Our team has been actively delivering food boxes and preparing to assist families with clothing needs as colder weather approaches. We've also made referrals to external organizations such as the Brighton Center and Northern Kentucky Community Action Commission to help families access utility assistance. Grandview recently hosted its first Family Night of the year, where we had the opportunity to meet and connect with several families. Thanks to a partnership with Gold Star, we were also able to provide dinner for the attending families.

### **BMHS - Report provided by Danielle Carr**

This month, the BMHS Youth Services Center has been actively engaged in several important initiatives. We continued our work on the center's audit and held a productive Advisory Council meeting. Sam Hubbard visited to help restock our community cupboard, supporting our ongoing food security efforts. Planning has begun for our upcoming Holiday Assistance Program, with a focus on identifying families most in need. We successfully launched Youth Leadership Development (YLD) sessions twice a week, which have been well-received by students. Additionally, the "Oh She Built That" program, a hands-on woodworking experience for girls, was hosted last week and met with great enthusiasm. We are also preparing for the Youth Summit, scheduled to take place at the end of the month.
