

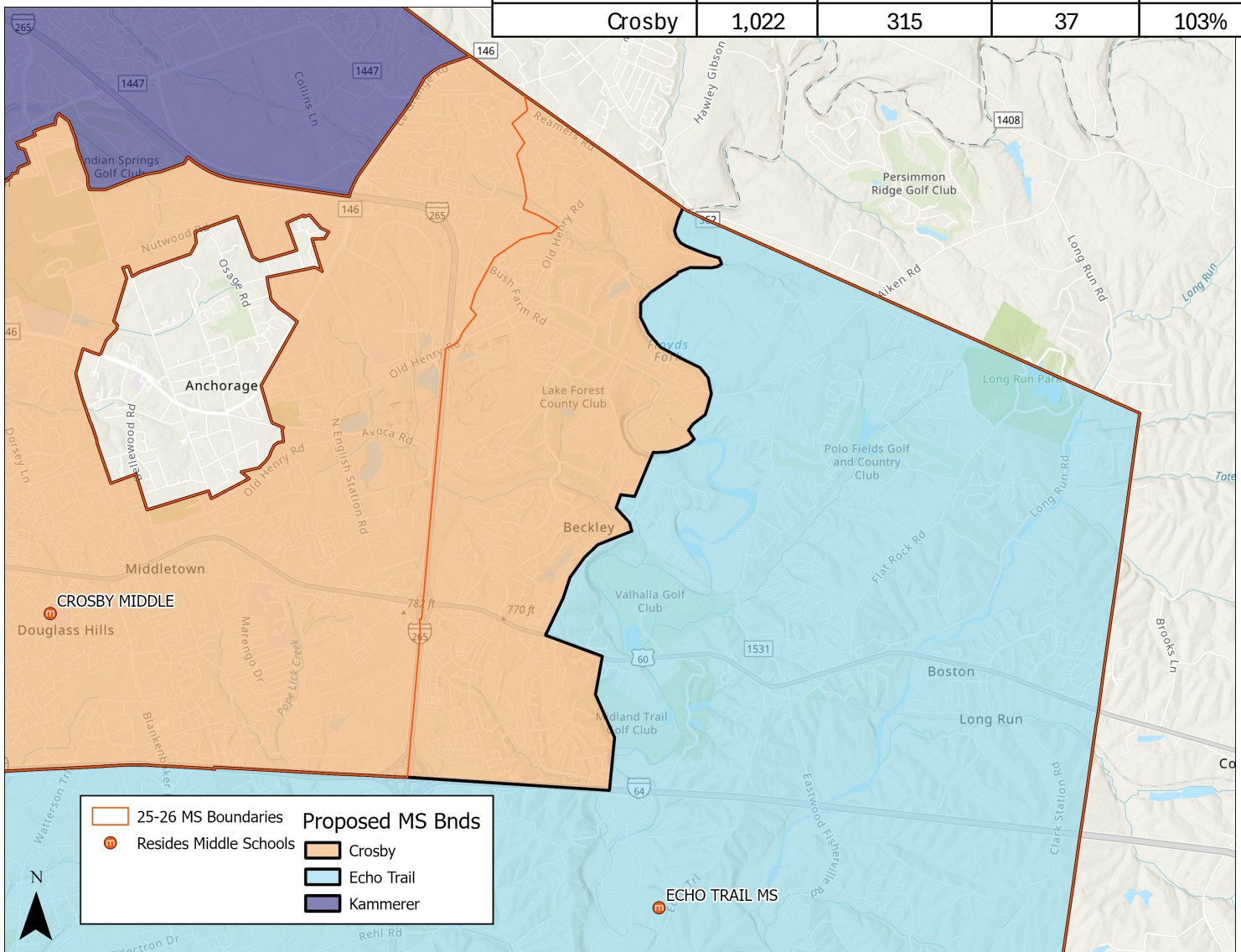
Echo Trail Middle School: Addressing Overutilization

Echo Trail Middle School, located in a fast-growing area of the County, is projected to become vastly overutilized over the next few years should current enrollment trends continue. The 6th grade class has seen significant growth each school year since the opening of ECMS. The recommendation involves moving the area north of 64 and west of the Valhalla Golf Club into Crosby Middle School, providing enrollment relief for Echo Trail without creating any new feeder splits.

Elementary Satellites: Addressing Overutilized Elementary Clusters

Some elementary clusters are experiencing overutilization at their resides elementary schools. Introducing satellite schools will offer an additional school choice to the most overutilized clusters, providing some overutilization relief without boundary changes.

It is recommended that Camp Taylor Elementary be utilized as a satellite elementary school for the Seneca Elementary Cluster.
