Sport Fall Golf

Weather conditions forced us to make two adjustments to the opening round of the girls' golf tournament. We initially decided early Monday evening to change Tuesday's first round to an 8 a.m. shotgun start, as opposed to starting off the No. 1 and No. 10 holes with scheduled tee times as usual.

Championship Update/Review

When the weather forecast worsened overnight, the decision was made by 7 a.m. the next morning to push the start time to a 12 p.m. shotgun start for the opening round. Though it rained for the first 1-2 holes after play started, the rain subsided and the opening round was able to be completed on Tuesday, thus avoiding changing the schedule/format for Wednesday's final round.

Fiscal and Budget Issues and Review (attendance, etc.)

Ticket sales were up for the boys' golf opening round (+77), girls' golf opening round (+55) and boys' golf final round (+93). Ticket sales for the girls' golf final round were down (-69) from the 2024 championships.

Noteworthy Changes / Anticipates Changes

This was the first year carts were made available to coaches with a full team entry at the state tournament, following Board action in the 2024-25 academic year, and several expressed their gratitude for the change. Though the commitment was only nine carts for each tournament in Bowling Green, we did hear complaints from spectators that met the ADA requirement but were not able to rent a cart (particularly at the boys' tournament due to increased attendance).
