I am currently participating in the **DPP Mentoring Program** for new Directors of Pupil Personnel in our region and have the privilege of mentoring the DPP at Dayton Independent Schools. Together, we are collaborating on some exciting attendance challenges between our districts for January and February. These are months when student attendance typically declines. Our goal is to create a friendly, positive competition that encourages students to improve their attendance and stay motivated. I am also exploring the idea of expanding our annual March Madness Attendance Challenge to include Dayton Independent and possibly other River City districts. More information will be shared soon, as we hope to finalize the details in December.

The **BASE teams** will continue to meet monthly, and I will share data and trends from these meetings during our district MTSS sessions. Subgroups of the BASE team also meet biweekly between full meetings to ensure we are consistently reviewing data and identifying any barriers affecting our students and families. This structure represents a strong step forward, bringing everyone together to support students and families in multiple ways.

WOO Award (Welcoming Outstanding Organizations Award): This initiative aims to highlight and acknowledge businesses and organizations that partner with our school district. The two organizations we are highlighting this month are the Bellevue Vets and the Bellevue Education Foundation.

The **2026–27 Academic Calendar Committee** will hold its first meeting next week. After gathering input from the committee, I will develop several calendar options to share following the Thanksgiving break. Committee members will then have one week to collect additional feedback. We will reconvene before the Christmas break to finalize the preferred option to present to the Board of Education for a first reading during either the December or January board meeting.

Tigers Read will begin this week and will meet every other week. Our high school mentor students will work with 2nd grade students using guided and decodable reading materials from Wonders, their high-quality literacy resource. We're very excited to launch this wonderful program for the year!

Both centers are actively preparing for the upcoming holidays to ensure that families and students have the support they need.
