1. School Mission: At Simpson Elementary, our mission is to spark each student to be ready for success.

## How the project will carry out the mission:

At SES, we strive to help our students succeed and be life ready in many ways. We, as third grade teachers, hold our students to high expectations and try to always incorporate the newest technology. Through the purchase of these Apple iPads and Apple Pencils, we would be able to deliver a hands on approach within our math classrooms. Currently, we are switching back and forth between a document camera trying to model problems and whiteboards in the back of the classroom. The delay of time and how students have to turn to face different ways when switching platforms causes talking and disruptions. This will make it easier for students to follow along and keep up with us as we go. These iPads would create a smooth transition to further student success.

Another perk of these iPads will be being able to print the day's lesson and content for students that are absent or for students struggling and need that further practice. This is much more time efficient rather than copying the content down for those students several times.

Lastly, students would be exposed to additional technology, but also students would able to see our work alongside their work in a much more clean, efficient, time saving manner. ELA is another subject that would benefit from this! Students often need sentence starters modeled in front of them. With these iPads and Apple Pencils, we would be able to directly model and mark up documents without the break of students turning to look at the whiteboard or the minutes it takes to get our document cameras pulled up and distractions/conversations stopped.

As we are teaching in the grade that is the first grade to get state tested, we believe this is something that will help our students succeed not only this year but in the years to come too. Students who have access to this learning are going to be more involved and less distracted which will in turn create a better understanding of the material being taught.

## 2. Describe in detail the specific activities and strategies of this project:

With all the new math standards being taught in 3rd grade, it is crucial that we can model these concepts for them. With the purchase of these items for us, it would allow us to do just that. From modeling spiral review during morning work, to ELA sentence starters, and arrays in math, these would make it easily accessible for us to model for them.

Our timeline is dependent upon when we are able to accumulate the funds for the materials necessary. The use would be implemented as soon as the items are purchased and received.
