Crusade Grant Rules

Grant Year - The grant year is from September 1, 2026 to August 31, 2027. Grants will be made only for programs or projects that can be completed in that time frame. Grants cannot carry over from one year to the next unless there are approved extraordinary circumstances.

Grant Scope

- Grants will be awarded only to programs implemented by non-profit agencies, schools, and hospitals whose primary function is the treatment or education of children with special needs 18 and under. Grants will not be awarded to individuals or for the benefit of a single child.
- Grants are awarded for specific purposes and programs. Agencies must request approval to change the purpose of the grant. Any savings realized will be retained by the WHAS Crusade for Children.
- Grants are awarded to support salaries for persons who work directly with children with special needs and not to support any remuneration beyond salary (including travel, benefits, and training). Grants will not be awarded for salaries for administrative services.
- Grants must focus on direct services to children with special needs. Grants will not be awarded to requests that focus solely on parents, other family members, or are strictly research based.
- Grants that address the socio-economic special needs of children will be reviewed through the filter of the primary mission of the WHAS Crusade for Children to address the physical, medical, mental, and emotional needs of these children.

Geographical Consideration - Crusade grants must be spent entirely for children in Kentucky and Indiana. No part of a grant may be sent to an affiliated national headquarters. Whenever possible, grants to Kentucky agencies are made from contributions given by the people of Kentucky; and Indiana contributions are allocated to agencies in Indiana.

Repeat Grants – Being awarded a Crusade grant one year does not guarantee the agency will receive further grants. Applications are studied individually and will be considered along with all other applications each year.

Public Accountability - The Advisory Panel insists that the public be kept informed about how contributions are used. When funds are used for building projects, purchase of vehicles or installation of equipment, the Advisory Panel requires that an appropriate marker be placed to identify them as gifts from the Crusade. (These markers are not paid for by Crusade grant funds.) The Panel also expects agencies receiving Crusade grants to credit the WHAS Crusade for Children in any publicity about those projects. If the funds are used to purchase equipment, vehicles or construction, please send a photo of the equipment, vehicle or construction along with a close up shot of how it is marked as being provided by the Crusade.

Lending Equipment - Grants awarded to provide equipment (to include animals) or services for an individual or a child's family must remain the property of the agency, school, or hospital. It can be loaned through an agreement for a designated period of time. At the end of the agreement, equipment must be returned or a new agreement established.

Vehicles - When buying a vehicle, the Crusade will not pay for insurance, license and transfer of title or any other expense connected with buying a vehicle.

Insurance - Equipment, buildings and vehicles purchased in whole or in part with Crusade funds MUST BE FULLY INSURED.

Buildings - Applications for building projects must include cost estimates based on an actual bid from an architect or contractor. Agencies receiving Crusade grants for remodeling or construction of a building should require the general contractor to post a performance bond as well as a bond covering payment to all subcontractors.

Grant Payments - When a grant is made, the money involved is retained by the WHAS Crusade for Children until its terms have been met by the applying agency. An AGENCY REIMBURSEMENT FORM must be accompanied by related vendor invoices. Agencies must pay all bills and then request reimbursement from the Crusade. The deadline for reimbursement requests is September 1, 2027.

Salaries - The Crusade does not pay benefits or employer payroll taxes. AGENCY REIMBURSEMENT FORMS must be submitted online with each reimbursement payment request.

The Crusade requires:

1. Accurate time sheets with hours worked and rate-of-pay or
2. Payroll registers/statements containing each person's name, payroll employee number, rate of pay and hours worked

Grant Priority - Each year, more money is requested by agencies than is available. Therefore, priority will be given to agencies serving children in Kentucky and Indiana counties where residents support the Crusade.

The WHAS Crusade for Children does NOT pay for the following items:

- Overhead costs, such as administrative positions, postage, copies, etc.
- PR or public awareness campaigns
- Benefits or any portion of employee benefits
- Extended warranties or installation for equipment of any type
- Taxes (the Crusade only funds tax exempt agencies who should only pay limited or no taxes)
- Shipping or freight expenses
- Employee continuing education/training or travel expenses/lodging
- Personal items, such as food, t-shirts, costumes, etc.

Audit Requirements/Financial Statements – Agencies that continue to undergo annual audits voluntarily, are requested to upload their most recent audit. All other agencies must upload Board approved Financial Statements from the current or preceding year.

Our one school services preschool through 8th grade, educating all students (with and without disabilities) who reside within our district boundaries. Our special education program serves a wide range of students, including those with speech and language impairments, autism, developmental delays, orthopedic impairments, hearing impairment, visual impairments, learning disabilities, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, medical conditions and cerebral palsy.

3. BRIEF PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Summarize in 150 words or less.*

The funds received from WHAS are utilized to support our school's mission. We continue to strive for the inclusion of our special education students to the greatest extent possible. Educating students with disabilities in an inclusive setting with non-disabled peers requires us to examine the resources we have and make sure that we are enabling our students with disabilities to have equal access to the classroom and school environment. As Kliewer and Bikhn (2001) found in their research, student inclusive learning environments facilitated the acquisition of literacy adaptive skills and enhanced social relationship for students with disabilities.

1. Redcat Classroom FM System – This system enables all students to hear the teacher's voice in the classroom. Listening is the primary channel for learning in the classroom, but physical factors such as distance and noise prevent students from hearing the full message, often missing critical components required for learning and understanding. Redcat delivers clear audio across the whole room to provide all students with equal access to instruction. The Redcat FM system provides support for students with a number of disabilities including auditory process disorder, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, language disability, and learning disabilities.

2. Tablets – As we continue to move toward inclusion of our students with disabilities in the general education classroom, we have determined the need for tablets to support our students. The 10 tablets will allow students to access reading programs at their level in the general education classroom. Students will be able to access Read Naturally, Lexia, and Starfall apps to receive individualized reading instruction with teacher direction. The tablets will also be used to create individualized social story videos to provide direct instruction managing and redirecting behaviors, as well as interactive daily visual schedules.

3. Switches from Enabling Devices – The switches from Enabling Devices and eSpecial Needs will provide our students with disabilities access to the general education curriculum by allowing them to actively engage in classroom instruction, participate in learning activities, and demonstrate their knowledge in ways that meet their individual physical and cognitive needs.

4. Sensory Items - Sensory items can play an important role in helping students with social-emotional deficits regulate their emotions and maintain focus throughout the school day. These tools such as fidgets, weighted items, swing, or textured materials help students manage sensory input and reduce feelings of anxiety or overstimulation. By providing appropriate sensory input, students can: Self-regulate emotions and calm themselves during moments of stress or frustration. Increase focus and attention, improving their ability to participate in classroom activities. Develop coping strategies for managing strong emotions in socially appropriate ways. Enhance social interactions by feeling more comfortable and confident in group settings. Build independence through recognizing and using tools that help them manage their own needs.

5. Micro Light Switch - A micro light switch provides students with disabilities a simple and effective way to engage with their environment and classroom activities. By enabling them to control lights, devices, or learning tools, the switch promotes independence, reinforces cause-and-effect understanding, supports fine motor development, and allows for increased participation in social and academic activities.

6. EasyStand Bantam Stander- The EasyStand Bantam Stander supports students with physical disabilities by allowing them to safely stand, which promotes bone health, circulation, and muscle development. It also enhances access to

classroom activities, facilitates social interaction by bringing students to eye level with peers, and encourages independence and engagement in learning.

7. Para Educational Instructional Assistant (2)

An essential part of providing for our students' participation within the least restrictive environment is the employment of paraprofessionals. Paraprofessionals provide natural support for students and teachers through the implementation of appropriate instructional strategies and educational opportunities that promote a positive learning environment focused on providing for each individual student's needs for success. Paraprofessionals provide accommodation and assistance which allows our students with more severe special needs to participate more actively and appropriately within the least restrictive environment; thereby providing more access to the general curriculum. An often-overlooked part of educating students with disabilities is providing for the social and emotional needs of students. They have extreme difficulties processing the environment around them from the physical to the social, the most detrimental of which is the inability of the student to process non-verbal and verbal cues during social interactions which research shows is one of the most important skills needed for individuals to be "included" within a group. Paraprofessionals through their unique roles can aide in providing emotional and social support for students through the modeling of appropriate behaviors and helping students to adapt to differing daily circumstances. Our paraprofessionals are well trained and receive professional development along with certified staff. They directly allow us to increase the frequency, intensity, efficiency and availability of services for our students. $\$20,000 \times 2 = \$40,000$

The items requested in this grant will provide the children of Anchorage School with the support and assistance to meet the demands of the education program successfully. With a total of 395 student attending Anchorage, 42 students have individual education plans and 32 students have 504 plans. Our special needs population is 19 % of our school population. To successfully attend and participate within the general education setting, additional resources are needed to meet the diverse needs of our students. Our greatest needs are for resources that will help them access and participate in the general education environment.

We will measure the success of the grant initiatives by reviewing data from the Federal December 1st Child Count and utilizing the Kentucky Continues Monitoring Plan. Other progress and success evidence measures will be increased student time in the least restrictive environment, individual student progress toward their specific goals as stated on their individual education plans, and continuing to meet the gap standards of the Kentucky Summative Assessment testing system.

Last year, Anchorage Independent School District received \$25,000 from the WHAS Grant. The Grant funding enabled Anchorage to purchase Redcat Classroom FM Systems for 9 classrooms, 1 gait trainer, decodable books, Handwriting Without Tears Program, and Chrombooks. The equipment made possible by the WHAS Grant have allowed students with disabilities to participate more fully in their general education classrooms with their non-disabled peers.

During the 2025-2026 school year, we have educated ## students in their least restricted environment with 80% of the

students spending greater than 80% of their time in the general education classroom. ##% of the students are educated in the general education classroom 40-80% of the school day. 100% of our students participate with Individual Education Plans participated with their non-disabled peers during essential arts classes and physical activity time.
