

Special Education and Preschool Board Report

December 2025

1. The December 1 count has been completed, submitted and verified. We currently have 40 students receiving special education, which is a decrease from 42 on last year's count.

The purpose of the December 1 count is to:

- Determine Federal IDEA Funding Allocations
 - The number of students reported drives the district's federal IDEA Part B funding for the next fiscal year.
- Ensure Accurate Data for State & Federal Accountability
 - o Monitor trends in identification, placement, and service delivery
 - Track progress toward state performance indicators (e.g., least restrictive environment, disability category trends, etc.).
- Verify Compliance with IDEA Eligibility & Service Requirements
 - o Every student included has a current, valid eligibility under IDEA
 - Each student has an active IEP or PSP (for parentally placed private school students)
 - Services are being implemented as written
- Support Private School Proportionate Share Calculations
 - o Determines the proportionate share set-aside for the following fiscal year
- Provide Data for Planning and Resource Allocation
 - Staffing (speech, OT/PT, psychological services, special education teachers)
 - Budget planning
 - Identification of trends such as increases in certain disability categories or service needs

2. Mr. Collett has been working to complete the fall Alternate Assessment testing. We currently have 3 students who qualify for alternate assessment. The fall testing window opened on November 10th and will close on December 19th.

Primary Purposes of Alternate Assessment:

- Ensure Inclusion in State and Federal Accountability Systems
 - IDEA mandates that every student be included in testing and accountability measures.
 - Alternate assessments allow states to collect valid data on student performance for those who cannot participate in standard assessments.
- Provide an Equitable, Accessible Way to Measure Student Progress
 - Alternate assessments measure achievement on state academic standards, but at reduced complexity, allowing students with the most significant disabilities to demonstrate what they know and can do.
- Support Instructional Decision-Making
 - Adjust instruction
 - Develop and revise IEP goals
 - Plan supports and accommodations
- Ensure Meaningful Participation for Students with the Most Significant
 Disabilities Only about 1% of the total tested student population qualifies
 for alternate assessments.
 - Students are not excluded from state assessments
 - Students demonstrate learning using methods appropriate to their communication, motor, or cognitive needs
 - Testing is respectful, valid, and individualized
