CDIP Planning Committee – (Dec. 2nd)

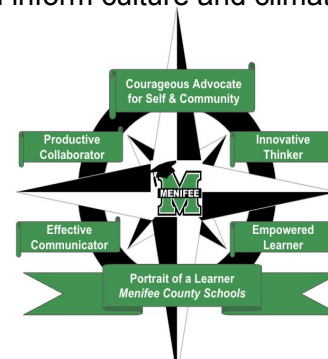
- Reviewed the districtwide **Needs Assessment**

- Students generated strong ideas for **academic acknowledgements** that will inform culture and climate strategies in the CDIP.

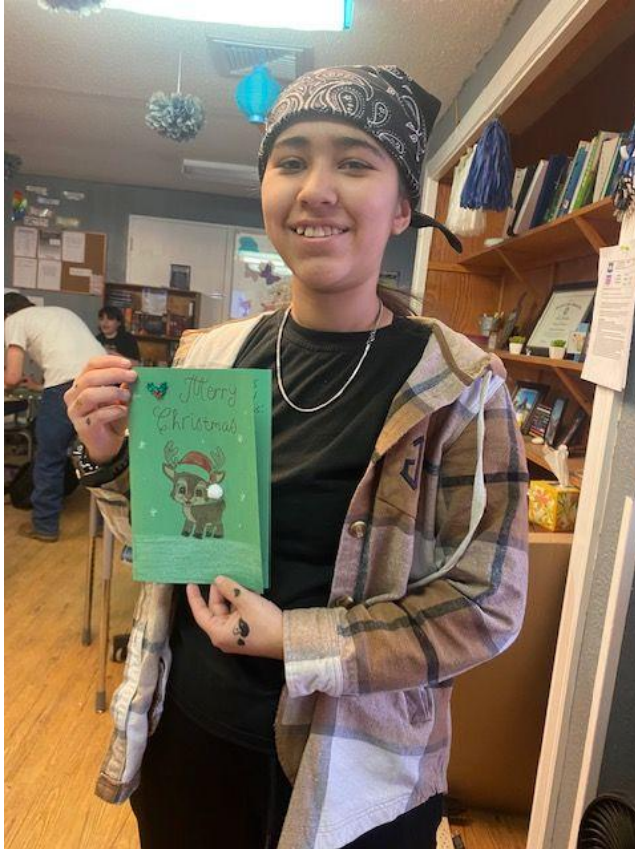
CDIP Draft Posted for Public Comment

- Project-Based Learning (PBL) focused on career development is wrapping up with culminating activity where students will take part in practice interviews.



Gifted and Talented

Activities for Central Students:

- i. Engineering Design Process using 3D pens
- ii. Practice using ELA gifted strategies to play vocabulary games
- iii. Practice using Math gifted strategies to play math strategy games
- iv. Practice using creativity skills to create 1 billion shapes puzzle
- v. Practice using science skills to design and create paper airplanes and launch them using snap circuit designs
- vi. Provided extended learning opportunities to students in mathematics based upon iReady scores

Activities for High School Students:

- vii. Shared information on KEES money and how to access KHEAA accounts
- viii. Shared list of scholarships for eligible students
- ix. Creates list of scholarships per grade level and shared
- x. Provided early application deadlines and information for seniors for various colleges
- xi. Provided application materials for Rogers scholars, Gatton, and Craft Academy for sophomores
- xii. Created and shared SAT prep materials for students, including a Kahn Academy prep course, practice tests, and study guides
- xiii. Students are enrolled in 38 various college courses and 5 are taking AP courses
