Safety

- School administrators and custodial leads conduct monthly safety walkthroughs throughout each building. During these inspections, they complete a detailed checklist to document current conditions and identify any areas requiring maintenance, repair, or further attention. This proactive process helps ensure a safe, well-maintained environment for all students, staff, and visitors.

Health Services

- School nurses have been diligently working to ensure that all students are up to date with required immunizations and health screenings, providing follow-up support to families as needed. In addition, Big Smiles delivered on-site dental services at two of our schools in December, giving students convenient access to preventive oral health care.

Student Services

Family and Court Liaison

- As of December 5, 2025, we have seen a 70% decrease in the number of filings related to truancy as compared to the same time period during the previous school year. However, the number of final notices have remained consistent between both reporting periods. After final notice, students/parents/guardians have been providing documentation to excuse absences. Furthermore, many students have now utilized all allowed parent/guardian notes for the year. Therefore, all further absences for these students would require another form of acceptable excusal documentation.
- Currently, there is a 100% decrease in 15 day complaint filings as compared to this time last school year.
- Attended the FAIR Team Meeting on December 11th. The FAIR Team is an acronym for Family Accountability, Intervention, and Response Team. These are multidisciplinary, local teams that work to divert juveniles with behavioral or other needs from formal court proceedings by providing community-based interventions. The FAIR teams were established as part of the 2014 juvenile justice reforms under Kentucky's Senate Bill 200.
