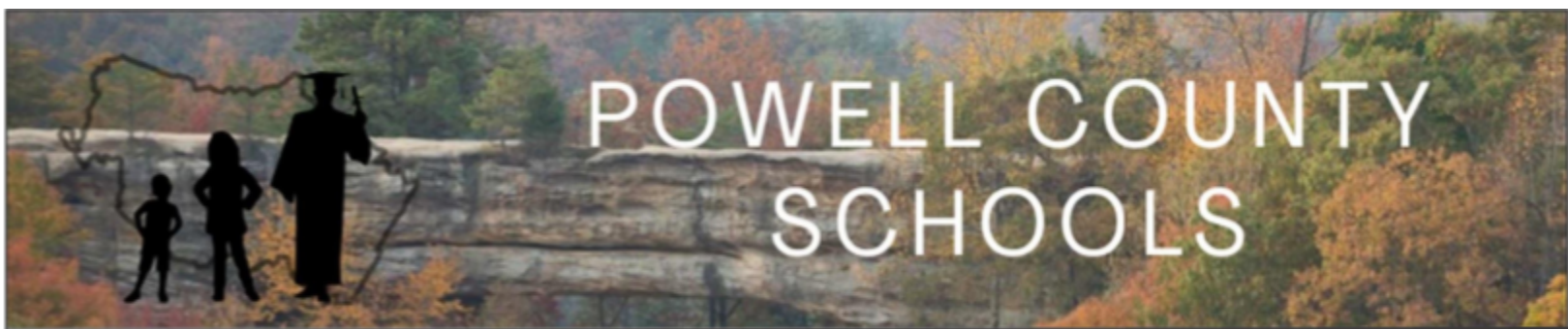




POWELL COUNTY SCHOOLS

By 2028 Powell County Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring Proficient/Distinguished in:

- Reading for Elementary from 33% (2025) to 42%, Middle School from 27% (2025) to 36%, and High School from 27% (2025) to 40%.
- Math for Elementary from 33% (2025) to 42%, Middle School from 24% (2025) to 31%, and High School from 22% (2025) to 31%.
- Science for Elementary from 25% (2025) to 34%, Middle School from 15% (2025) to 25%, and High School will increase from 14%(2025) to 24%. .
- Social Studies for Elementary from 30% (2025) to 39%, Middle School from 19% (2025) to 30%, and High School from 36% (2025) to 45%.
- Combined Writing/Editing and Mechanics for Elementary from 23% (2025) to 33%, Middle School from 20% (2025) to 30%, and High School from 38% (2025) to 47%.

By 2028 Powell County Schools will increase:

- Postsecondary readiness status from 84.8 to 87.8.
- Climate index for Elementary from 78.7 to 81.7, Middle School from 66.0 to 74.2, and High School from 60.9 to 65.4.
- Safety index for Elementary from 73.4 to 78.6, Middle School from 56.0 to 62.8, and High School from 56.3 to 59.8.

KCWP 1: Design and Deploy Standards

- Curriculum Specialists continue to support reading teachers in implementation of the new High Quality Instructional Resource.
- Training provided from Houghton Mifflin Houghton, Savvas, McGraw Hill as well curriculum specialists for teachers based on the new curriculum.
- Collaboration with CKEC to support standards alignment with instructional resources.
- Social Studies training connected to Kentucky Academic Standards and document usage.

KCWP 2: Design and Deliver Instruction

- District and building leadership will use Elements of Effective Lesson walkthrough document district wide to evaluate and monitor instruction.

KCWP 4: Review, Analyze and Apply Data Results

- KSA (Kentucky Summative Assessment) test scores from previous school year analyzed for areas of growth.

- NWEA MAP assessment data will be analyzed following each administration and students will be identified who need additional support in the tested area.
- Provide alternative learning environments to support pathways to graduation based on student data. (Powell County Academy, Virtual Learning Academy, Connect Academy, Dean of Students at PCHS and Drop-out prevention staff member)

KCWP 5: Design, Align and Deliver Support

- District administration, building administration and MTSS teacher committee will work to align processes for MTSS (Multi-Tiered Systems of Support) at both the district and building level.
- Daytime ESS (Extended School Services) provided at every school level.

KCWP 6: Establishing Learning Environment and Culture

- Review, add or remove career and technical education pathways based on the results of a needs assessment.
- Increase collaboration and planning with Estill ATC, MSU, Murray, ECU and MCTC.
