Bylaw 23 questions have been addressed to several member schools. Schools were reminded that during the regular season, meet management can utilize the KHSAA official platform of Milesplit to title and utilize the meet information page to indicate the level being conducted at track & field meets.

KHSAA/Milesplit will also provide additional steps for member school coaches to learn how to properly label meets within Milesplit's platform, which is a recognized necessary next step in aligning all member schools on the same platform. Consistent with other sports, this allows member schools to know the level being conducted before registering athletes and enables school administrators to monitor the season limits at each level. As Bylaw 23 states, each meet shall be classified at the same level by all participants, and all schools shall treat it equally.

Update/Review**

The state championships will take place on March 3-4-5 in Norton Healthcare Sports & Learning Center, Louisville. Class 1A will compete on March 3, Class 3A on March 4, Class 2A on March 5. We have maintained constant communication with our partners at Milesplit and the registration/qualifying process for the 2026 State Meet member schools will see minimal changes from the 2025 meet. The same events and process for qualifying will be utilized. State Championship instructions will be sent to member schools early in the new year.

As we have consistently and repeatedly reminded the member schools, any meets hosted by a KHSAA member school must use MileSplit for registration, which will enable the instant upload of results for student-athletes. This is also an important next step in ensuring competitive equity. As we have consistently reminded our schools, any member school with a documented and verified exclusive legacy agreement with other platforms will need to sunset those agreements after the 2025-26 school year, following a two-year wind-down period. If a member school attends a meet that does not use Milesplit registration during the 2025-26 school year, it is the member school's responsibility to ensure that the results are uploaded to Milesplit in the proper format within 48 hours after the meet's completion.
