

- **Outside Therapy Services:** The counselors of Southgate have had a partnership for outside therapy services with DCCH for over a decade. Finding outside therapists that

connect with our students and fit the needs of our community is something that is often difficult. We are very pleased that DCCH has been accommodating in helping us in this search. After Christmas we were joined by a new therapist who immediately jumped in and started connecting beautifully with our students. We are also beginning a partnership with OneQuest Health (formerly the Childrens' Home of Northern Kentucky) who will also be able to provide school based therapy and other wrap-around services for our students and their families. We are hopeful that having two options for therapists will help us make sure all students' needs are met. We currently have fifteen students meeting with outside service providers or in the referral process.
