



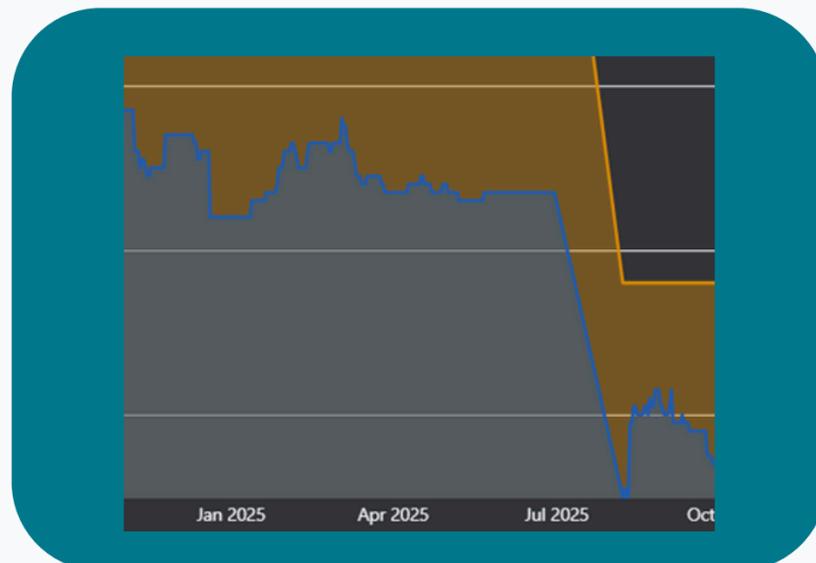

2026-27 Enrollment Projections

- **Develop student enrollment projections** for initial budget allocations
- **Compile annual room usage surveys, floor plans, building walk-throughs, and Infinite Campus schedules** in order to determine optimal building capacities
- **Analyze daily projected enrollments** to identify past patterns and predict future trends in order to ensure funds are allocated properly to schools



Optimal Capacity

- **100% is THE ideal** target based on the design of the building, but it does not mean a school is completely full
- **A range of 85-115% is optimal**, allowing schools to decide how to use their flexible space

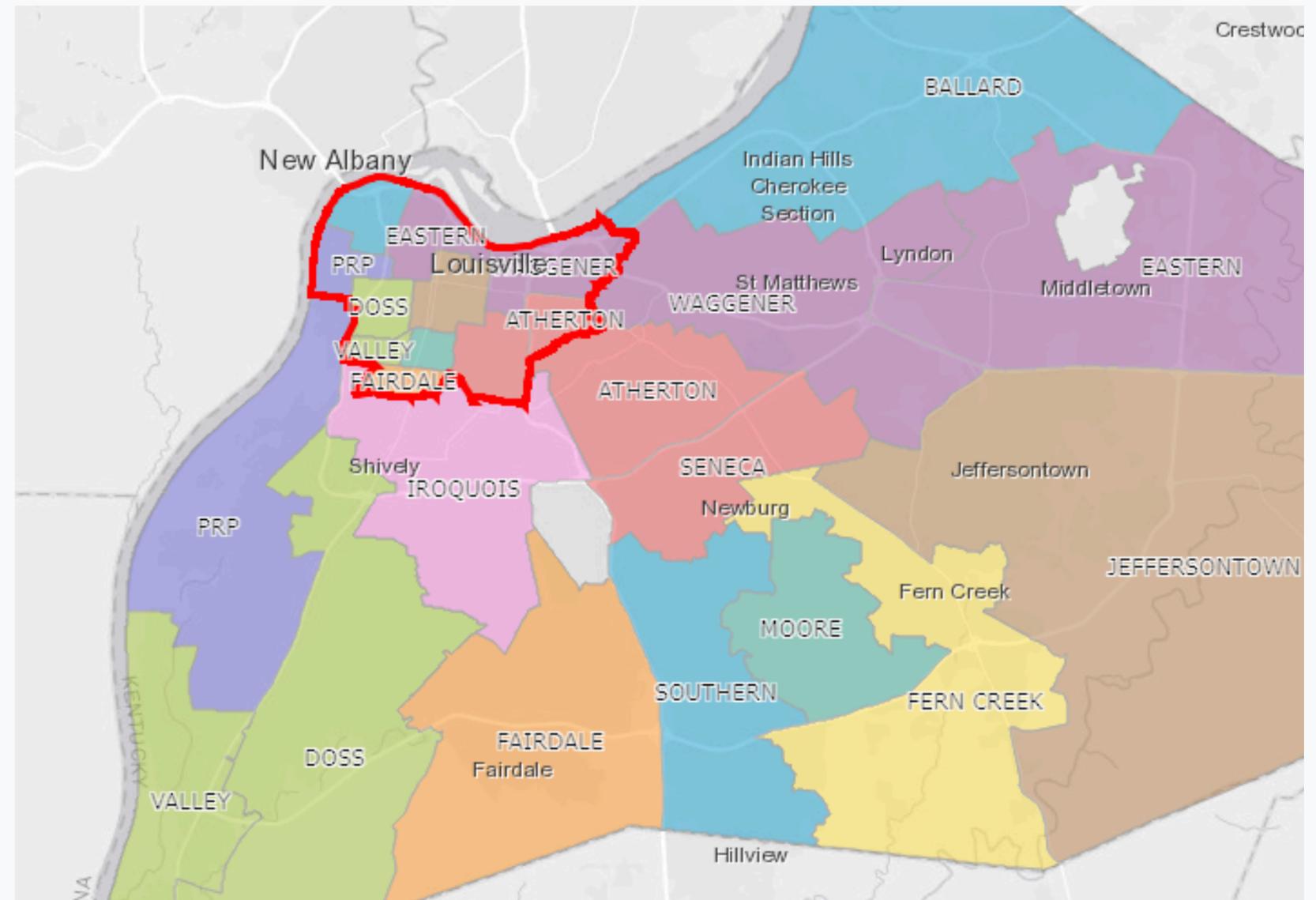


2026-27 Enrollment Projections

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) is used to develop and maintain data

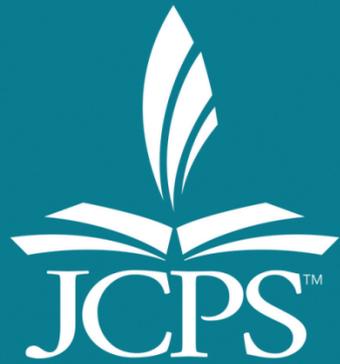

School Funding Allocation Formula



Compliance: School Allocation Standards comply with 702 KAR 3:246



Data-Supported: All schools are funded based on student counts and specific student needs



Formula: Funding formula allocates certified staff (section 4), classified staff (section 5), and supplies (section 6) to all locations at required levels



Additional Expenses: Indirect operating expenses (utilities, facility needs, etc.) are provided outside of the school allocation formula as required by section 3

School Funding Allocation Formula

Additional funding beyond required levels may be allocated to schools as desired by local school districts

JCPS makes additional investments in our schools by allocating certified teaching staff at a **better-than-the state-required student-teacher ratio**

School Funding Allocation Formula

Non-teaching staff are allocated as follows:

Elementary

- **Principal:** One per school
- **Assistant Principals:** One per school
- **School Counselor:** based on enrollment
- **Librarian:** one per school
- **Library Media Clerk:** based on enrollment
- **School Secretary:** One per school
- **School Clerk:** One per school
- **Lunchroom Office Assistant:** One per school
- **Instructional Assistant:** One per school

Middle

- **Principal:** One per school
- **Assistant Principals:** Based on enrollment
- **School Counselor:** based on enrollment
- **Librarian:** one per school
- **Library Media Clerk:** One per school
- **School Secretary:** One per school
- **School Bookkeeper:** One per school
- **School Clerk:** Based on enrollment
- **Records Clerk:** One per school

High

- **Principal:** One per school
- **Assistant Principals:** Based on enrollment
- **School Counselor:** based on enrollment
- **Librarian:** one per school
- **Library Media Clerk:** Based on enrollment
- **School Secretary:** One per school
- **School Bookkeeper:** One per school
- **School Clerk (8 hr):** One per school
- **School Clerk (6.5 hr):** Two per school
- **Records Clerk:** One per school
- **Attendance Clerk:** Based on enrollment

Operational Support *beyond the \$160.50 per pupil allocation*

(SEEK per pupil \$4,586 times 3.5% = \$160.50)



Middle, and High Schools: \$35 per pupil Textbook Allocation in flexible funding



Elementary Schools: \$35 per pupil for Textbook Allocation in flexible funding

School Funding Allocation Formula

JCPS School Funding Allocation Formula meets or exceeds all state school allocation requirements

Additional school funding allocated by JCPS

- Student Needs-Based funding
- Exceptional Child Education funding
- Multilingual Learners funding, including ELD Teachers and Counselors
- Special funding for school programs such as Magnet programs, Academies of Louisville, and Explore Academies



School Funding Allocation Formula : Student Needs-Based Funds

Based on JCPS Student Needs Index

- JCPS Needs Index = $0.5 (\%FRL) + 0.3 (\%Mobility) + 0.15 (\%ECE) + 0.05 (\%ELL)$
 - % Free Reduced Lunch – 0.5
 - % Mobility – 0.3
 - % Exceptional Child Education – 0.15
 - % English Language Learner – 0.05

School Funding Allocation Formula : Student Needs-Based Funds

Based on JCPS Student Needs Index

- All Elementary, Middle, and High schools receive flexible Student Needs-Based Funds
- Enhanced Support for Zone Schools
 - Permanent Auxiliary Teacher / In-School Security Monitor
 - Teachers Class Sized Reductions

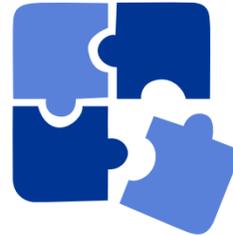

Assumptions



Revenue Growth: Anticipating a 4% tax increase in property tax revenue and a 4.5% increase in property tax assessments.



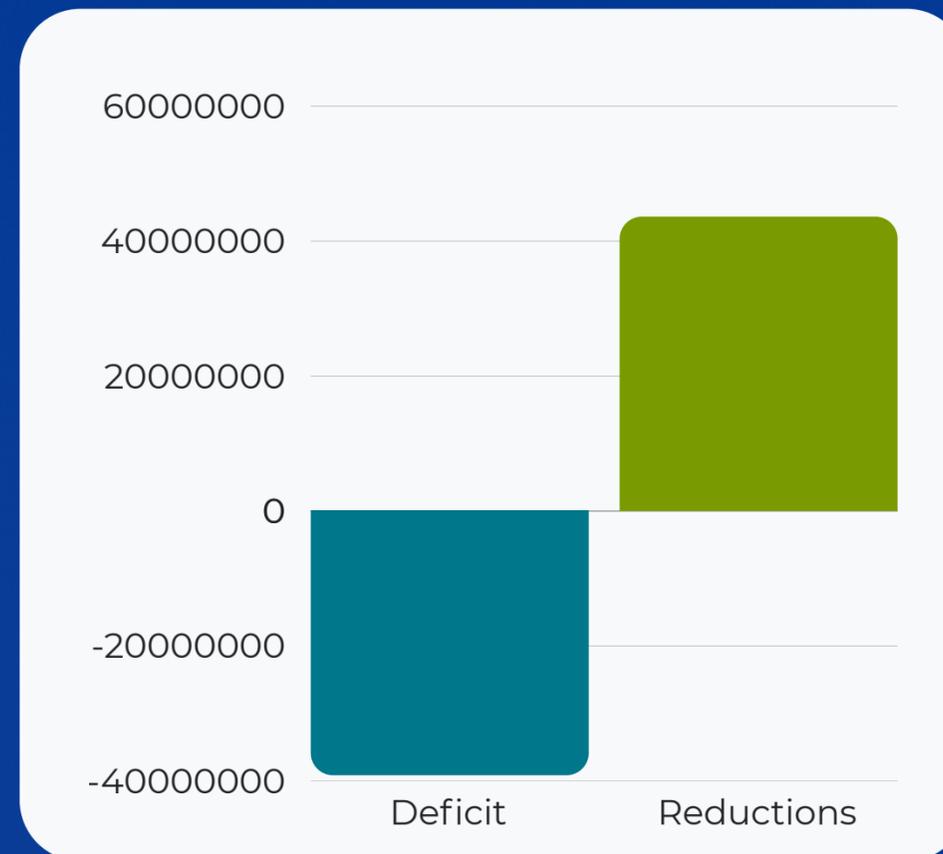
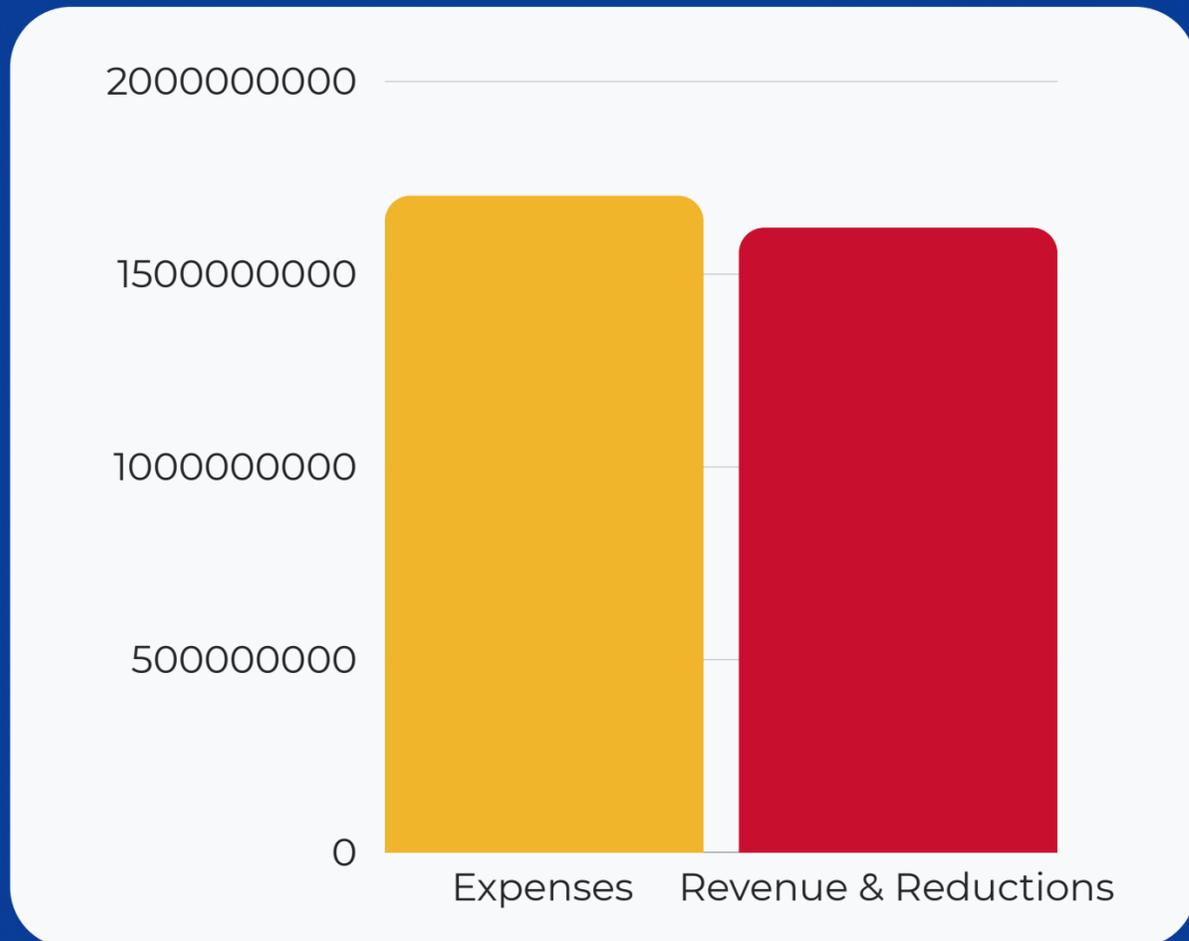
State Funding: SEEK base per-pupil funding is assumed to remain stable at \$4,586.



Expense Controls:

- Removal of one-time expenses.
- Cost of utilities remains stable.
- No Cost-of-Living Allowance (COLA) included.
- Continuation of annual step increases for employees.

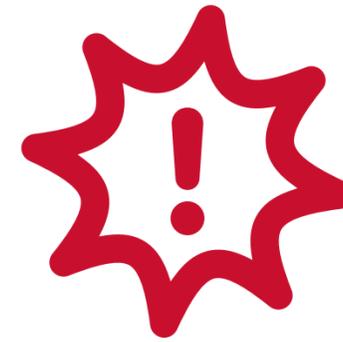

Historical Deficit Spending

JCPS has operated with annual expenses exceeding revenues by relying on the Fund Balance and Unused Salaries to cover the shortfall.



Critical Juncture

The Beginning Fund Balance is being depleted as expenses continue to outpace revenues.



Reducing Expenses

Immediate action is being taken to reduce total expenses to prevent the Fund Balance from falling below the level necessary to maintain the required cash flow and Contingency balance.

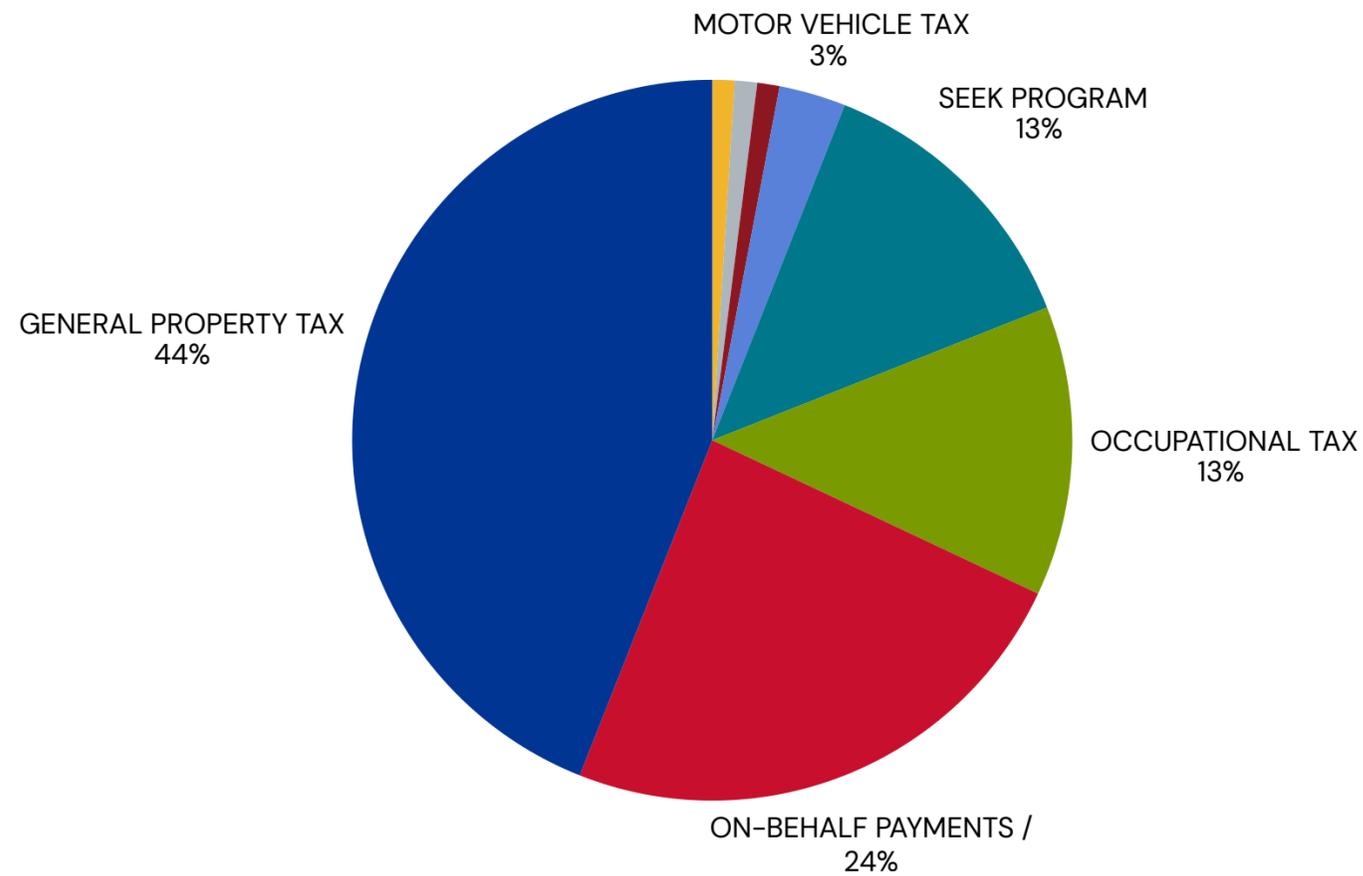
Forecasting Model

Forecasting Model Verification per Alvarez & Marsal

The JCPS Financial Forecasting Model provides a directionally accurate overview of JCPS's structural deficit in FY27 and in future years, but the realized deficit may be materially above or below what the model produces:

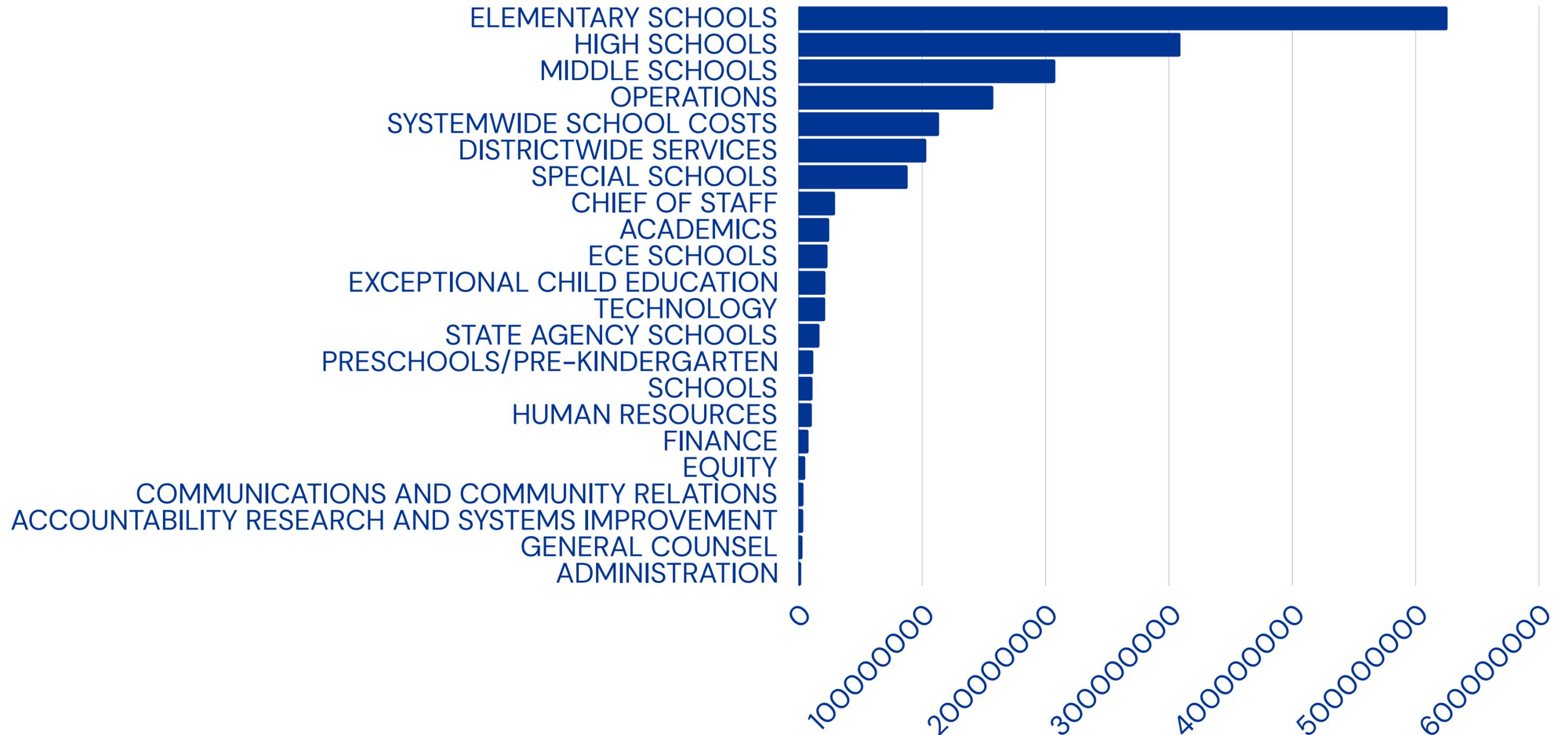
- The model provides a strong perspective of financial outcome for the current fiscal year, but there are significant challenges with long-term forecasting
- Revenue projections are realistic, with some assumptions backed by analysis, while others need enhancement for accuracy
- Expense growth is less precise and may leave out expected increases in non-personnel increases
- The model has some functionality to test scenarios, such as COLA increases and total reductions, allowing for limited scenario planning

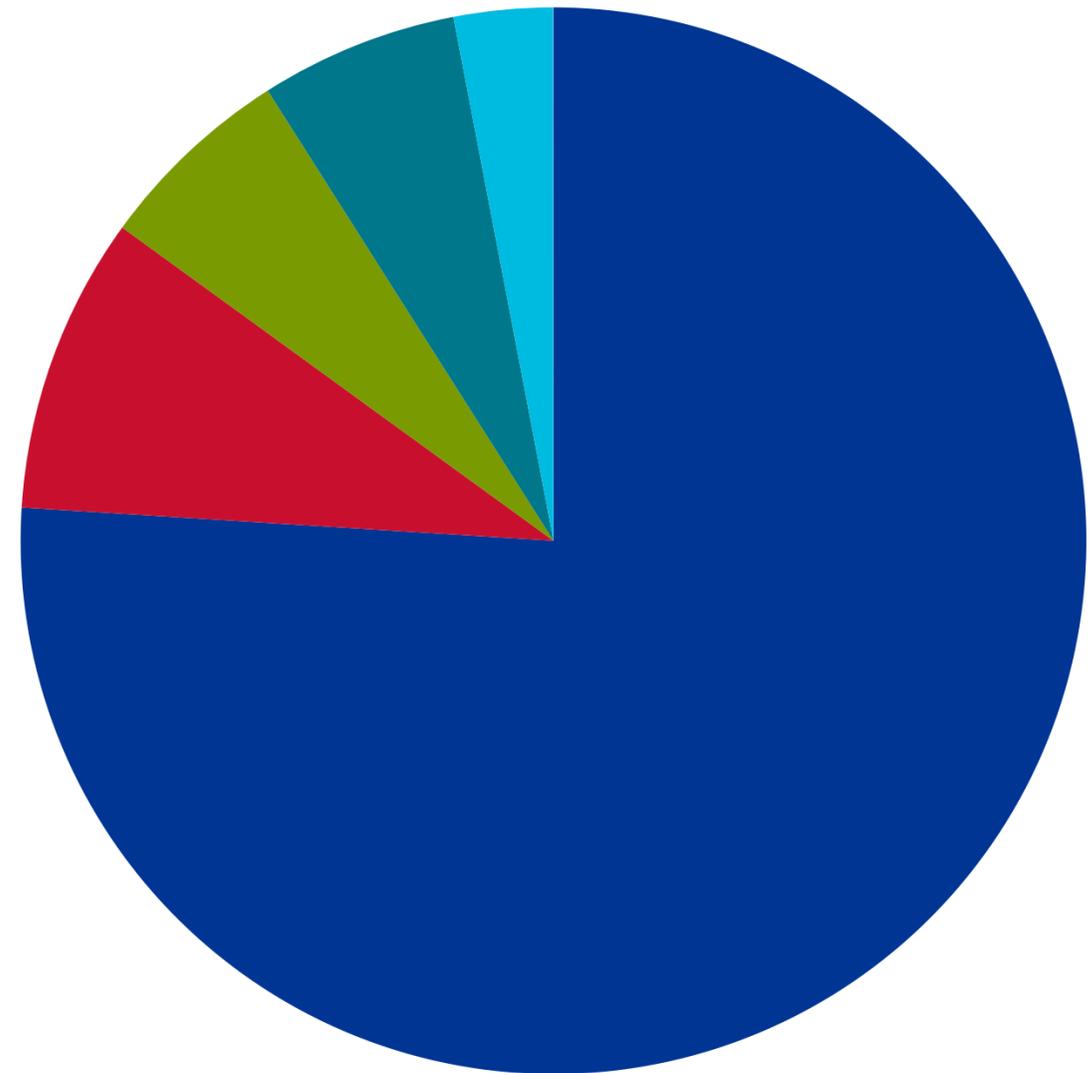
