12/18/25 As a Board Member, I attended the Northern Kentucky Education Council Board of Educators meeting with Northern KY superintendents, business leaders, and retired educators.

12/19/25 Met with Mrs. Slankard and The New Teacher Project (TNTP) to discuss the upcoming professional learning day on January 5th.

12/22/25 Attended a district leadership meeting where we spent time planning the implementation of our Comprehensive District Improvement Plan.

Met with TNTP and school and district leadership teams to discuss the professional learning day on January 5th.

Met with Divisions Maintenance Group to discuss how we are currently addressing facilities needs in our district and explore ways to become more efficient.


Standard 2: Instructional Leadership

This month, I'd like to continue highlighting our work on Standard 2: Instructional Leadership. On January 5th, all three schools participated in professional learning based on research from The New Teacher Project (TNP). Newport Primary and Intermediate focused on *The Opportunity Makers*, while the High School explored *The Opportunity Myth*.

The Opportunity Myth shows that meaningful student learning happens when students consistently experience four essential elements: access to grade-level work, strong instruction, meaningful engagement, and high expectations. When these elements are in place every day for every student, outcomes improve, and students are better prepared for the future—regardless of background.

The Opportunity Makers highlights that schools are most effective when they focus on three core conditions: **belonging** (students feel safe, supported, and valued), **consistency** (students regularly receive strong, grade-level instruction), and **coherence** (staff are aligned around clear goals and expectations). When these conditions exist, students are more likely to catch up academically and thrive.

This professional learning is ongoing and supported through the Kentucky Comprehensive Literacy Grant. Over the coming years, the district will continue building systems that promote belonging, ensure consistent access to grade-level instruction, and maintain coherence across district goals and expectations.
