Background/Rationale: The NWEA MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) assessment is a computer-adaptive test designed to measure student academic achievement and growth over time. Unlike traditional standardized tests that measure proficiency against a fixed standard, MAP adjusts the difficulty of questions based on a student's responses. If a student answers a question correctly, the next task is more challenging; if they answer incorrectly, the next task is less complex. This adaptive format provides a more precise measure of a student's instructional level, identifying what they are ready to learn next. The MAP assessment is typically administered three times per year: fall, winter, and spring, in subjects like reading, mathematics, and language usage. The trend data over the past three years are represented as percentiles.

The FCPS Comprehensive District Improvement Plan articulates specific student achievement goals in Reading and Math that the MAP assessment data allows our district to monitor progress and respond to trends that may lead to acceleration and intervention.
