Printers 8

Laptops 38 (all 8+ years old or broken beyond repair)

Projectors 4

Switches

LCD Monitors 61 (all VGA and or 4/3 not used with modern equipment)

desktops 132 (all incapable of running Windows 11 or broken beyond repair)

UPSs 3

Document cameras 6

Large format printers 1

Chromebooks ~500 (5+ years old or broken beyond repair, and incapable of running the current Chrome OS; all salvageable parts have been removed from these devices to be reused)

The broken parts that have been replaced as part of the 1:1 Chromebook repair program, as well as a good number of broken devices that we scavenged parts from to keep the program cost-effective.

Along with several boxes of cables, headphones, keyboards, mice, and small hardware. As well as a few pieces of severely dated technology, ex: overhead and slide projectors, Coax TV equipment, Tape and record players.

This number may increase slightly if more junk is found before pickup, but it will match the same description.

The plan is to use the state e-waste contract to have this equipment properly disposed of. This includes the CRT TVs and a few odds and ends that would be costly to dispose of, as they are hazardous materials. They will also pay us for the non-hazardous materials and verify hard disk destruction this safeguards any student and staff information that is still on any of the drives.
