Special Education and Preschool Board Report

- 1. The March 1 count for Preschool is due by February 28th. We have a couple of student who are in the evaluation process and their eligibility will be determined before the due date.**

How are Preschool Students Funded?

- The revised Kentucky Statute (KRS 157.3175), determines district preschool program funding based on the average number of preschool children served on December 1 and March 1 of the prior academic year.
- The sum of the December 1 and March 1 average is multiplied by per-child rates. The per-child rates are approved by the Kentucky Board of Education.
- The funding enrollment numbers are pulled from the Infinite Campus report Preschool Enrollment Count.
- Therefore, it is essential that districts make sure that all eligible preschool children are accurately on or before each of the determining dates.



2. This year's Preschool and Kindergarten Registration will be on Thursday, April 2nd from 5:30pm – 7:00pm.



3. The 2026-2027 Preschool Budget is due in GMAP by March 31st
4. Special Education MAP Scores Update

MIDDLE SCHOOL WINTER MAP TEST INFO:

71% of Middle School students receiving Special Education services in the area of **Reading** increased their MAP scores from Fall to Winter

The student with the highest growth score in Reading increased from the 9th percentile to the 53rd percentile.

75% of Middle School students receiving Special Education services in the area of **Math** increased their MAP scores from Fall to Winter.

The student with the highest growth score in Math increased from the 7th percentile to the 50th percentile.



ELEMENTARY SCHOOL WINTER MAP TEST INFO:

80% of Elementary School Students receiving Special Education services in the area of Reading increased their MAP scores from Fall to Winter.

The student with the highest gain in Reading increased from the 13th to the 51st percentile.

75% of Elementary School students receiving Special Education services in the area of **Math** increased their MAP scores from Fall to Winter.

The student with the highest gain in Math increased from the 15th to the 44th percentile.
