The **BASE teams** continue to meet monthly, and I will share key data and trends from these meetings during our district MTSS sessions. Additionally, smaller subgroups from the BASE team meet every two weeks between the full team meetings. These biweekly meetings help us regularly review data and identify any barriers that may be affecting our students and their families. Kelly Savicki from NKCES attended our most recent BASE team meeting at GES. She plans to provide feedback on the current process and suggest ways we can strengthen it. We are looking forward to hearing her insights. Overall, the MTSS framework is helping us ensure that we are collecting the right data and working closely with the appropriate stakeholders to support student success.

WOO Award (Welcoming Outstanding Organizations Award): This initiative aims to highlight and acknowledge businesses and organizations that partner with our school district. The organization we are recognizing in February is Perfettu Van Mel.

Tigers Read will meet again Friday, February 13th. They will continue to meet every two weeks for the remainder of the school year. They will focus on their guided reading/decodable text that correlates with the Wonders reading series. I love to watch the students interact and build relationships with one another.

Open Enrollment: We will hold open enrollment throughout the month of February for any out-of-district students interested in attending Bellevue, as well as for any Bellevue residents who are not currently enrolled in the district. The communication coordinator and I have been working on various reels to promote open enrollment and why people should choose Bellevue. Below is the summary of the reels we have released and are planning to release. I have put the current views as of 2/10/26.

Transition Activities: Last week, we met with our transition planning team to decide how we want this year's 5th grade transition to middle school to look. Our main goal is to make sure students have enough time to become familiar with the new building and to start building relationships with the staff at BMHS. We are tentatively planning a week-long transition program where 5th grade students will visit BMHS each day, with a different focus area each day. The five focus areas will be:

1. How to use lockers
2. Extracurricular activities & Athletics
3. Support services (Youth Service Center, mental health, and counseling)
4. Band
5. A building scavenger hunt

Several staff members from both schools will be involved in this transition plan to support the students. We also talked about changing this year's "Portrait of a Graduate" presentations. We want to give students more time to present and allow time for questions, so the BMHS staff can get to know the incoming 6th graders better. This year, these presentations will take place in May during Tiger Tracks, in the students' homeroom classes at GES, in the afternoons. To help students stay focused and prepared for their presentations, Mr. Pelgen will meet with the 5th graders during Tiger Tracks in February, March, and April. We are very excited about this plan and look forward to giving our students more time to adjust to middle school.

Grandview Elementary:

The Family Resource and Youth Services Center (FRYSC) at Grandview Elementary is actively engaged in several initiatives. A grant is currently being written to support ongoing programs. Hubbard's Cupboard has been relocated to the first floor to improve accessibility. Collaboration with the preschool program is underway to explore new ways to engage families and increase awareness of the Family Resource Center (FRC) within the district. Additionally, student aid from BHS is available on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. The center is also working toward completing the Family Friendly Schools certification.

Bellevue Middle/High School:

The Youth Service Center at Bellevue Middle/High School is offering several exciting programs for students. The Youth Leadership Development (YLD) program is available for high school students on Tuesdays from 3:00 to 4:30 PM, and for middle school students on Thursdays at the same time. Both sessions are held in Mrs. Carr's room.

The Cinderella's Closet program is open to junior and senior girls and provides a chance to get ready for prom. Spots are limited, and only Mrs. Carr can sign you up. This opportunity is available only from March 12th to 14th.

Another great opportunity is "Oh She Built That!", a hands-on workshop happening on Tuesday, March 10th from 3:30 to 5:30 PM, and again on Wednesday, March 11th from 2:15 to 4:15 PM. There are only 10 spots available for this event.

Lastly, the Cooking Club meets every Wednesday in March and on the first Wednesday in April from 2:15 to 3:15 PM. This club also has only 10 spots available.
