The **BASE teams** continue to meet on a monthly basis, and I will share important data and trends from these meetings during our district MTSS sessions. In addition, smaller subgroups from the BASE team meet every two weeks between the full team meetings. These biweekly meetings allow us to regularly review data and identify any barriers that may be affecting our students and their families.

After reviewing feedback from Kelli Saviki from NKCES, I revised the meeting agenda to include time for each subgroup to share their celebrations and challenges. This addition encourages all stakeholders at the table to collaborate, contribute ideas, and work together to find solutions that best support our students.

Kindergarten Registration - We had a very successful Kindergarten Registration event that was well attended, even though the weather was not ideal that evening. In addition to our current preschool families, seven new families joined us, giving us a great opportunity to connect with them and welcome them to the program..

WOO Award (Welcoming Outstanding Organizations Award): This initiative aims to highlight and acknowledge businesses and organizations that partner with our school district. The organization we are recognizing in March is The Avenue Brew.

The **Tigers Read** group will meet again on Friday, March 27. They will continue meeting every two weeks for the remainder of the school year. During these sessions, students will focus on guided reading and decodable texts that align with the Wonders reading series. I enjoy observing the students as they interact with one another and build positive relationships.

The **Code of Conduct Committee** has been established, and I plan to hold our first meeting within the next couple of weeks.

Both coordinators are currently working on our portfolio submission for the Family Friendly Certification. They are doing an excellent job, and I am looking forward to seeing the finished project.

Grandview Elementary:

I attended an orientation for returning coordinators to review expectations and prepare for the upcoming period. Next week, we will participate in training focused on updated standards. We also hosted a table at kindergarten registration, where we had the opportunity to meet new families and share helpful resource lists with them. In addition, over the next four weeks we will distribute resource bags at Tiger Tots, which include items such as laundry kits and hygiene supplies to support families.

Bellevue Middle/High School:

We continue to expand opportunities for student engagement and leadership. The Cooking Club has begun for high school students and will be offered to middle school students next month. OSBT (Oh She Built That) has also resumed, providing additional opportunities for student involvement. Recently, several students who do not typically participate in activities have begun coming in and engaging more with programs and supports. We are currently implementing YLD during Focus once per week to support social-emotional learning (SEL), with a related community service or activity component taking place after school on Thursdays. In addition, the Teens Teach Tech program has launched with four student participants so far, and we have received very positive feedback about the program.
