Safety

- School administrators and custodial leads perform monthly safety walkthroughs in each building. During these inspections, they use a walkthrough tool to record existing conditions and note any maintenance needs, repairs, or follow-up actions. This proactive approach supports a safe, clean, and well-maintained environment for students, staff, and visitors.
- Attended the KCSS Regional Meeting on March 12th. Safe Schools Coordinators, State School Security Marshals, and the Kentucky Center for School Safety were all represented. Participants received updates on legislation, explored training opportunities, and engaged in roundtable discussions.

Health Services

- School nurses continue to work on health record compliance while also expanding their efforts to ensure student safety and well-being. They are conducting comprehensive reviews of student health files to verify accuracy, completeness, and adherence to current regulatory and district policy requirements. This includes updating immunization records, care plans, and emergency contact information, as well as identifying any gaps or inconsistencies that need to be addressed.
