

**The Kentucky Board of Education (KBE) held day one of its regular meeting on February 4, 2026. The KBE met virtually via Microsoft Teams due to weather conditions. Members of the public were encouraged to view the meeting on the Kentucky Department of Education's (KDE) Media Portal. The board conducted the following business:**

**I. Call to Order**

Chair Sharon Robinson welcomed all board members and guests to the meeting. The meeting was called to order at 1:00 P.M. ET.

**II. Roll Call**

Chair Robinson asked for a roll call of members. Harper Blake and President Aaron Thompson were absent. KDE Director of Education Policy GlyptusAnn Grider Jones, Ph.D., stated a quorum was present.

Pile also discussed her visit to Adair County where she was able to watch senior student defenses of learning. Lu Young said she was able to attend the winter convening of the Kentucky United We Learn Council. Juston Pate provided an update on the High School Transformation Work Group, saying that the next meeting will take place on February 26. Alfonso De Torres Núñez raised questions about teacher input on special education caseload regulations. Chair Robinson and Dr. Jones agreed to provide further information to board members on this topic.

## **X. Action/Discussion Items**

**A. Report on the United We Learn/Teaching and Learning Committee on Action/Discussion Items**

United We Learn/Teaching and Learning Committee Chair Holly Bloodworth provided an update on the committee's meeting. Chair Bloodworth shared that the committee heard from We Lead Computer Science staff regarding their virtual computer academy which helps students to earn industry certifications, offers job shadowing, and mock interviews. We Lead CS, which began as an initiative to expand computer science access in rural Kentucky and was later established as a statewide virtual career academy by the General Assembly, with a mission to increase competitiveness, expand access, and prepare students for tech careers.

**B. Report on the State Schools Committee on Action/Discussion Items**

State Schools Committee Chair Randy Poe provided an update on the committee's meeting. Chair Poe shared that the committee heard updates regarding the ongoing analysis and recommendations for revising the Area Technology Center (ATC) salary schedule to address recruitment and retention challenges for occupation-based instructors and administrators, with input from a diverse work group and feedback from committee members.

**XI. Review Items**

**A. Presentation of Strategic Dashboard- KDE Chief Performance Officer Karen Dodd and KDE Strategic Plan Manager Susan Strange**

KDE Chief Performance Officer Karen Dodd and KDE Strategic Plan Manager Susan Strange presented on [KDE's strategic dashboard](#). The goal of the dashboard is to keep KBE members, the commissioner, KDE staff, and all stakeholders informed of KDE's progress towards the department's goals, Dodd said. Board members provided feedback and suggestions on the implementation of the dashboard.

**B. Update from 2026 Kentucky Teacher of the Year (KTOY)**

Chair Robinson welcomed 2026 Kentucky Teacher of the Year Michelle Gross and KDE Program Consultant Allie Green. Gross introduced herself to board members and spoke about her experiences as an educator. Gross will spend a six-month sabbatical experience with KDE as a part of her year-long term as KTOY. Robinson congratulated Gross for being named a finalist in the Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) National Teacher of the Year competition. Gross said she will participate in

finalist interviews in March. Board members congratulated Gross for being named KTOY and wished her well in the national competition.

### **C. Legislative Update**

KDE Director of Government Relations Dr. Brian Perry presented the legislative update to the board. Dr. Perry provided updates on the current legislative session, highlighting key bills and their potential impact on education. Dr. Perry addressed member questions regarding specific bills and discussed topics such as transportation funding, the accountability system, and financial transparency.
