The third KHSAA Indoor Track & Field Championships saw an increase of 63 athletes from year two to year three. We have continued to see a growth in participation, not only in the postseason but many new schools now participating in the sport.

Update/Review**

As we continue our partnership with Milesplit/FloSports, we continue to consistently and repeatedly remind the member schools, any meets hosted by a KHSAA member school must use MileSplit for registration, which will enable the instant upload of results for student-athletes. This is a step in ensuring competitive equity. As we have consistently reminded our schools, any member school with a documented and verified exclusive legacy agreement with other platforms will need to sunset those agreements after the 2025-26 school year, following a two-year wind-down period.

If a member school attends a meet that does not use Milesplit registration during the 2025-26 school year, it is the member school's responsibility to ensure that the results are uploaded to Milesplit in the proper format within 48 hours after the meet's completion.
