Juniors took the ACT on April 21, and we now await the results. This may not be the last time we take the ACT, as the governor has vetoed the SAT contract for failure to follow Model Procurement procedure. We will be in limbo until October concerning the state required testing at the earliest.

Concerning the test results, we received this email this week:

As part of our continual evaluation of scores, we have discovered a need to reissue scores for students who took the online test this spring during school-day testing. This need relates to an update to the process used to ensure all test scores are fair and accurate, regardless of when and how a student tested. We will be communicating again with you when your students' revised scores are uploaded to online reporting. *Composite score and section scores will remain the same OR go up slightly based on your individual performance. Your scores will NOT be lower.*

We have completed the KSA, except for a few make-ups. We should get initial scores back for Quality Control in early August.

In good news, the EPSB conducted a workgroup and came away with the recommendation to expand middle school math certifications to be allowed to teach Algebra I and Geometry. Hopefully this will lead to future considerations to expand other certification areas.

Lots of discussions, focusing on next year, are currently going on.
