Grandview Elementary:

This spring, I continued coordinating our weekend food bag program and plan to distribute the remaining bags on the last day of school. I also partnered with Dayton FRYSC and the Freestore Foodbank to host a produce pop-up, which had a strong turnout and great support from our community. Looking ahead, I am working with 21st Century to plan a Family Fun Day on June 19 at Bellevue Beach Park, where we will provide SkoolAid and connect families with additional community resources. In the meantime, I am also trying to prepare for summer programming and support opportunities for our students and families.

Bellevue Middle/High School:

This week, I am wrapping up both the middle school and high school YLD programs. Each group selected an organization to receive a \$500 donation, and students will present those donations during a special ceremony. Throughout the year, students participated in several community service projects, but many especially enjoyed helping clean up the community. I am also finishing up the middle school cooking club, and due to high interest this year, we had to offer two separate clubs for the first time. In addition, I completed our family-friendly portfolio and am proud to share that we had over 2,000 individual contacts and more than 2,000 group contacts throughout the year. We also partnered with Dayton for a produce pop-up event that provided fresh produce to more than 200 families.
