

Junk/Surplus

Reason:

To officially declare legacy network infrastructure assets as surplus property. The equipment consists of various obsolete or decommissioned network switches and wireless access points that have reached manufacturer End of Life (EOL) or End of Engineering Support status. These units are no longer capable of receiving critical security firmware patches, lack active vendor hardware replacement warranties, and have been safely removed from production environments during infrastructure modernizations.

Item:

Surplus Network Hardware Inventory – Various Legacy Extreme Networks Switches and Wireless Access Points.

Synopsis:

Approval is requested to designate a lot of decommissioned Extreme Networks networking gear as surplus property and authorize the IT department to dispose of the equipment in accordance with local governance policies. Because these devices can no longer be updated to defend against current cybersecurity vulnerabilities, they cannot be redeployed within the organization. Disposal methods will include electronic waste recycling and/or public auction of un-wiped hardware to recoup residual salvage value where feasible. All organizational data and configurations have been or will be cleared prior to final removal.
