- 420 students were seen during the 2025-2026 school year through the school-based health center. Services included physicals, sick visits, and vaccines. Over 430 vaccines were administered. The school-based health center through a MOU with HealthPoint Family Care was open from mid-October through May. The nurse practitioner was at Newport Schools two days per week (½ day at Newport Primary School, ½ Newport Intermediate School, and 1 day at Newport High School).

### Student Support

- 6th–12th grade school counselors attended the Kentucky Advisory Academy Scope and Sequence training on April 21st at Gateway Community and Technical College Boone Campus to strengthen their understanding of how to intentionally promote postsecondary readiness through the implementation of Individual Learning Plans (ILPs). The training focused on developing a comprehensive, grade-level approach that supports students in exploring career interests, setting academic and personal goals, and building the skills necessary for success after high school. Counselors gained strategies and resources to help students make meaningful connections between academic planning, career exploration, and future opportunities beginning in the early stages of ILP development. A follow-up in district meeting took place on Tuesday, May 19th to further explore implementation efforts for the 26-27 school year.
