FEBRUARY 3, 2011

A moment of silence was observed in the passing of Rick Folden's grandson. He was sixteen days old and died after a very short illness. Sam Henny, a student at St. Francis High School also died unexpectedly this week. Keep both school families in your prayers.

Scott Greenwald, President, called the meeting to order.

Approval of minutes:

A motion to accept the minutes as written were made by Mitch Irvin seconded by Anthony Howard, and approved.

Financial Report:

Financial report was deferred to the next scheduled meeting.

Realignment:

Mr. Wyman started the discussion regarding the KHSAA alignments saying we are a body of athletic directors entrusted by the KHSAA to voice our opinions as a Metro group for the good of our group. If no agreement or consensus is reached the metro group will not send a recommendation to the Board of Control. The Board of Control will make the determination of alignment assignments.

Two plans were mainly discussed, one in which Mike Crawley and Mike Beard spearheaded and another Scott Greenwald led. Scott's plan included the Bullitt County schools and one did not, showing the difference with each.

After a lengthy discussion of both alignment plans a vote for taken to see how the group felt. The plan from Mike Crawley and Mike Beard had 16 AD's in agreement and Scott Greenwald's plan had 19. Therefore neither plan would be endorsed by the Metro AD Association to the Board of Control.

The Board of Control will meet Monday, February 7, 2011.

Deadline to submit proposals for the Delegate Assembly is May.

This proposal included the three Bullitt County High Schools in a region known as the 7th. This plan did not reach consensus and will not be endorsed by the Metro AD Association.

Seventh Region basketball alignments with baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball.

"The overwhelming sentiment ... has been to at least standardize what regions these five sports are in and, if possible, the same districts," Tackett said. "This allows for scheduling ease, natural rivalry build-up and an overall increase in operational efficiency."

But the effects on basketball dominated talk Tuesday, with the potential for several new rivalries.

The boys' powers in the Sixth Region — according to the current Courier-Journal Litkenhous Ratings — would be Ballard, Central, Eastern, Male, Manual, Seneca, St. Xavier and Trinity. Powers in the Seventh Region would be Bullitt East, Butler, DeSales, Fairdale, Fern Creek, Iroquois, Jeffersontown, Moore, Pleasure Ridge Park and Western.

The girls' Litratings show Assumption, Ballard, Central, Christian Academy, Eastern, Male, Manual, Presentation and Sacred Heart as the top teams in the new Sixth Region. The Seventh Region would be led by Butler, Bullitt Central, Bullitt East, Fern Creek, Holy Cross, Jeffersontown, Mercy and PRP.

J'town boys' coach Jeff Morrow noted that his school no longer will be in the same region as traditional powers Ballard and Eastern but that he hopes to keep both teams on the schedule.

"Our priority will be to continue our current rivalries and create some new ones," Morrow said.

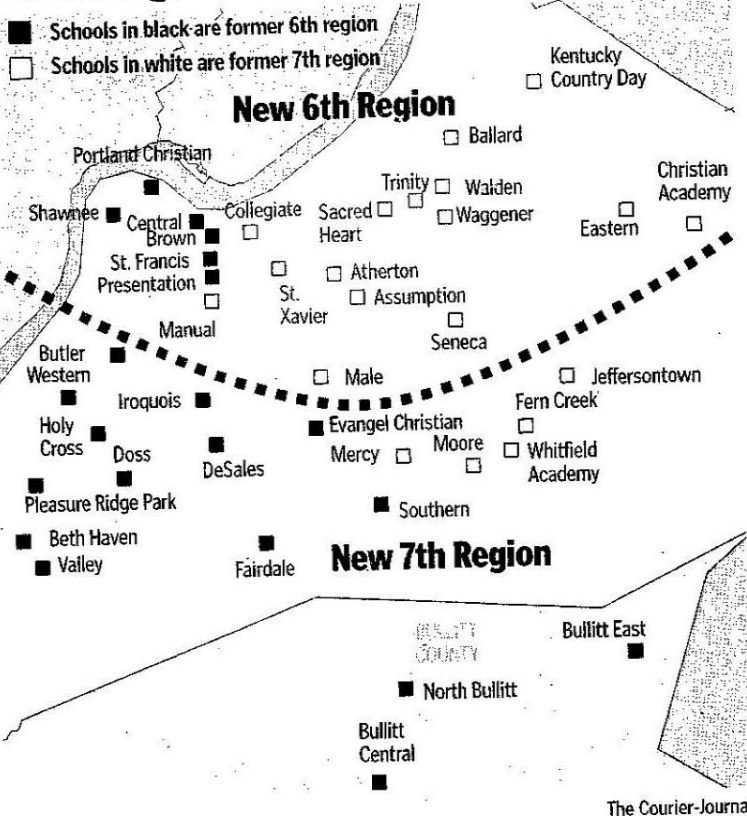
Mark Evans, who coached Mercy to the girls' state title last season, no longer will have to battle traditional powers Manual and Sacred Heart for a regional crown.

Starting next season Mercy will play in the 28th District with Bullitt East, Fern Creek, Jeffersontown and Whitefield Academy.

"I'm excited about the new district," Evans said. "They wanted something that geographically made sense, and this makes the most sense geographically."

Perhaps those most disappointed with the realignment were officials from the three Bullitt County schools, which had asked the KHSAA to be moved out of the Louisville-area regions and into the Fifth or Eighth.

Tackett said it wasn't feasible to
