

Keeping Kids Safe From Abuse and Neglect as Educators and Youth Serving Organizations

Developed by the Kosair for Kids Face It Movement, this course provides information free of charge from local experts around recognizing child physical, sexual, and emotional abuse and neglect, reporting suspected child abuse and neglect in Kentucky, and the appropriate documentation, how to respond to the child, and understanding the response of child protective services with information provided by the Department for Community Based Services. There is a video and assessment for educators in elementary schools, educators in middle and high schools and those in general educational settings.

Districts will determine the means for administering the required post-training assessment. It is the district's responsibility to confirm successful completion by staff members and to maintain accurate documentation of records. To distribute the assessment, schools may provide a hard-copy or input the assessment into electronic format (score will be given at end of assessment).

Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention

[KRS 156.095](#)

Each local school board shall adopt one or more trainings from the KDE approved list for implementation within the schools. The trainings shall include a questionnaire or other assessment tool upon completion to document basic knowledge of training components. All certified school district employees and public charter school employees shall complete at least one (1) hour of each of the approved training within twelve (12) months of initial hire and at least once every four (4) years thereafter.
