

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Between

Jefferson County Board of Education

And

Fairdale Fire Protection District, Inc.

This Memorandum of Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") is entered into between the Jefferson County Board of Education dba Jefferson County Public Schools (hereinafter "JCPS"), a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, with its principal place of business at 3332 Newburg Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40218 and the Fairdale Fire Protection District, Inc. (hereinafter "FFPD"), a Kentucky corporation located at 10015 Mitchell Hill Road, Fairdale, Kentucky 40118.

WHEREAS FFPD will provide learning experiences to JCPS students enrolled in the Junior Fire Fighter program.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions, premises, and mutual agreements set forth herein, JCPS and FFPD agree as follows:

1. **Duties of JCPS:** JCPS will ensure students are eligible to participate in the Junior Fire Fighter program, which will include:
 - a. The Student is enrolled in JCPS Fire Science Pathway, and they have completed the following courses: Basic Fire Fighting I, II, III. Student will be enrolled in Basic Fire Fighting IV to be considered for an internship or co-op with FFPD.
 - b. Obtaining parental consent for students to participate in the Junior Fire Fighter program.
 - c. Student has obtained the following Industry Certifications:
 - i. Stop the Bleed
 - ii. OSHA-10
 - iii. Basic Life Support with Health Care Provider (AHA).
 - iv. National Incident Management Systems (NIMS) 100, 200, 700, and 800.
 - d. Students are encouraged to take the Hepatitis B vaccination.
2. **Duties of FFPD:**
 - a. FFPD will adhere to the guidelines for participation of Junior Fire Fighters incorporated as Attachment A.
 - i. FFPD will ensure all Junior Fire Fighters are in compliance with State Regulations and complete Haz-Com, Bloodborne Pathogen, and Sexual Harassment training once brought into the program.

- b. Acknowledges that projects involving program evaluation, monitoring activities, or data collection or research of any kind, are subject to JCPS IRB review and approval as determined by the JCPS IRB to meet federal, State, and Board policies. In these cases, JCPS student or staff participation is voluntary. As a federally authorized Institutional Review Board (IRB), JCPS complies with the federal definition for research, which includes sharing of Personally Identifiable Information (PII) for the purpose of answering a question or evaluating activities for effectiveness beyond standard educational or operational procedures. Thus, all research, program evaluation and data collection activities must be approved by the JCPS IRB and shall not begin before approval is secured from the JCPS IRB.
- c. If the performance of this Agreement involves the transfer by JCPS to FFPD of any data regarding any student that is subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, 20 U.S.C. 1232g as amended, ("FERPA"), FFPD and JCPS must manage the data transfer in accordance with FERPA requirements, and FFPD agrees to the following conditions:
 - i. If FFPD requests transfer of identifiable data by JCPS that is subject to JCPS IRB procedures, as determined by the JCPS IRB to meet federal, State, and Board policies, JCPS cannot transfer identifiable data to FFPD before the JCPS IRB-approved informed consent process has been executed. In this case, FFPD does not function as an exception under FERPA. FFPD is responsible for obtaining, and maintaining, signed consent after JCPS IRB approval. No data will be provided under this agreement without signed consent from the guardian for records requests involving students or from the JCPS employee or community member for records requests involving adults. FFPD must deliver copies of the signed authorization to JCPS upon request.
 - ii. If FFPD has been legally deemed a FERPA exception by JCPS in accordance with FERPA Exception Conditions, then FFPD shall:
 - (a) In all respects, comply with the provisions of FERPA, including any requirements of Chapter 99 of Title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations and any other applicable state or federal law.
 - (b) Use any such data for no purpose other than to fulfill the purposes of this Agreement and not share any such data with any person or entity other than FFPD and its employees, contractors, volunteers, and agents, without prior approval of JCPS. Disclosure shall be limited to only those employees, contractors, volunteers, or agents who are necessary for the fulfillment of this Agreement.
 - (c) Require all employees, contractors, volunteers, and agents of FFPD to comply with all applicable provisions of FERPA with respect to any such data. FFPD shall require and maintain confidentiality Agreements with each employee, contractor, volunteer, or agent with access to data pursuant to this Agreement.

- (d) Maintain any such data in a secure environment, whether physical or electronic, and not copy, reproduce, or transmit any such data except as necessary to fulfill the purposes of this Agreement. FFPD shall notify JCPS within 24 hours in the event of any data breach or disclosure of data to any person or entity other than the parties listed in this agreement.
 - (e) Collect, store, and maintain data in a manner that does not permit the identification of an individual student by anyone other than employees, contractors, or agents of FFPD necessary for the fulfillment of this Agreement and having a legitimate interest related to the purposes of this Agreement in knowing such personal identification, and not disclose any such data in a manner that would permit the identification of an individual student in any form, including, but not limited to, published results of studies.
- d. Use reports produced for this project only for the purposes described above. The data and reporting shall not be used for personal or institutional gain or profit.
- e. To direct all communication and decisions regarding the evaluation, data collection, and analysis to the Accountability, Research, and Systems Improvement office.
- f. Acknowledges that JCPS retains the right to audit FFPD's compliance with this agreement.
- g. FFPD acknowledges that any violation of this Agreement and/or the provisions of FERPA or accompanying regulations related to the nondisclosure of protected student information constitutes just cause for JCPS to immediately terminate this Agreement pursuant to Article V of this Agreement.
- h. Not use the name or logo of JCPS or individual JCPS schools in printed materials, websites, videos or social media without prior approval from JCPS.
- i. Maintain an all-risk property and casualty insurance policy with respect to the facilities and a policy of commercial general liability in amounts no less than \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000 per policy and provide JCPS with a certificate of insurance upon request.
- J. Require all FFPD employees/volunteers/contractors performing services under this Agreement to have on file a Criminal Records Check, per Kentucky law and JCPS requirements, completed no more than five years ago. Employees/contractors convicted of any of the following, per JCPS Board Policy 03.6, shall not be considered:
 - i. Any conviction for sex-related offenses.
 - ii. Any conviction for offenses against minors.
 - m. Any conviction for felony offenses, except as provided below.

- iv. Any conviction for deadly weapon-related offenses.
 - v. Any conviction for drug-related offenses, including felony drug offenses, within the past seven years.
 - vi. Any conviction for violent, abusive, threatening or harassment related offenses.
 - vii. Other convictions determined by the Superintendent/designee to bear a reasonable relationship to the ability to perform services under this Agreement.
- k. FFPD shall require all staff and volunteers performing services on JCPS school premises during JCPS school hours under this Agreement to submit per KRS 160.380 to a national and state criminal history background check by the Department of Kentucky State Police and the Federal Bureau of investigation and have a letter, provided by the individual, from The Cabinet for Health and Family Services stating no findings of substantiated child abuse and neglect records maintained by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services.
 - l. FFPD staff and volunteers will comply with all JCPS health safety guidelines including rules related to COVID-19 mitigation.
 - m. To the extent that JCPS facilities are closed to students, those facilities will also be unavailable to FFPD. During any periods of the Non-Traditional Instruction (NTI) or remote learning, JCPS facilities will not be available to FFPD.

3. Mutual Duties:

- a. Each party shall not discriminate based on race, color, national origin, age, religion, marital or parental status, political affiliations or beliefs, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, veteran status, genetic information, disability, or limitations related to pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions.
 - b. Each party shall comply with all federal and state laws and regulations and all JCPS policies applicable to the provision of the services described in this Agreement, including without limitation the Federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Kentucky Educational Rights and Privacy Act (KFERPA), the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and JCPS policies and procedures for volunteers and visitors entering JCPS facilities.
 - c. The respective administrative offices of JCPS and FFPD who have responsibility for the implementation of this Agreement shall meet periodically during the term of this Agreement to evaluate the program and discuss issues of mutual concern.
4. **Term:** This Agreement shall be effective commencing July 1, 2026, and shall terminate on June 30, 2027. The Agreement Shall automatically renews annually up to four (4) times, for a maximum of five (5) one-year terms.

5. **Termination:** Either party may terminate this Agreement prior to the end of its term by giving sixty (60) days prior written notice to the other party. If JCPS terminates the Agreement, FFPD will be permitted in their discretion to continue to provide services during the period in which the sixty (60) day notice becomes effective. JCPS may terminate this agreement immediately in the event of a student health or safety concern or a breach of paragraph 2.j above. In the event of an immediate termination, FFPD shall not be permitted to continue to provide services after receipt of the notice of termination.
6. **Amendment:** This Agreement may be modified or amended only by a written agreement signed by JCPS and FFPD.
7. **Independent Parties:** JCPS and FFPD are independent parties, and neither shall be construed to be an agent or representative of the other, and therefore neither shall be liable for the acts or omissions of the other. Each party shall, however, be liable for any negligent or wrongful acts of its own employees, students and invitees.
8. **Captions:** Section titles or captions in this Agreement are inserted as a matter of convenience and reference, and in no way define, limit, extend, or describe the scope of this Agreement.
9. **Entire Agreement:** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between JCPS and FFPD concerning the FFPD and supersedes all prior agreements, either written or oral, regarding the same subject matter.
10. **Severability:** If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this Agreement unenforceable, such provision shall be modified to the extent required to make it enforceable, consistent with the spirit and intent of this Agreement. If such a provision cannot be so modified, the provision shall be deemed separable from the remaining provisions of this Agreement and shall not affect any other provision.
11. **Counterparts:** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, in which case each executed counterpart shall be deemed an original, and all executed counterparts shall constitute one and the same instrument.
12. **Applicable Law:** This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

ATTACHMENT A

Guidelines for Junior Fire Fighters

Junior Fire Fighters (JRFF) shall never:

- Serve as the Incident Commander during non-emergency and/or emergency responses;
- Participate in the place of trained personnel during non-emergency or emergency responses;
- Engage in any non-emergency or emergency activities which may expose the JRFF to any situation which may be Immediately Dangerous to Life or Health (IDLH) as defined by the U.S. National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) involving any fire or smoke conditions, to include structure, vehicle, dumpster, wildland, liquids, gases, or rubbish fires; and/or operating in any Hazardous Materials control activities.
- Operate hydraulic or power tools while on a non-emergency or emergency incident scene;
- Operate an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) or utility task vehicle (UTV) while on a non-emergency and/or emergency incident scene;
- Participate in missing person(s) search/rescue/recovery non-emergency and/or emergency responses;
- Participate in ventilation on a non-emergency and/or emergency incident scene which involves the JRFF encountering an IDLH;
- Climb ladders during non-emergency or emergency incident responses to include aerial and/or ground ladders;
- Be responsible for apparatus operations;
- Be responsible for or participate in traffic control activities;
- Respond to an incident, either non-emergency or emergency, and arrive to the scene while operating a Privately Owned Vehicle (POV);
- Install and/or operate a POV with any type of emergency warning device while responding to a non-emergency or emergency incident and/or have such warning devices installed in their POV.

Junior Fire Fighters on an incident scene may assist with the following activities:

- Accountability (shall ONLY assist assigned accountability officer);
- Rehabilitation Area (Rehab);
- Exterior operations of hose to include operations and relocation of hose 3" or less in size, rolling and loading of hose outside an IDLH atmosphere;
- Retrieval of equipment and/or tools from apparatus

Training Requirements Junior Fire Fighters:

- May attend other classes not identified below when approved by fire chief and JRFF Program Coordinator, when no IDLH activities are involved;
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- Fire Fighter (FF) Olympics (when approved by the fire chief and JRFF Program Coordinator)
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- Safety
- Communications Fire Behavior (see below requirements for "live" fire training)
- Portable Extinguishers (using a burn pan no larger than 36" x 36")
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Forcible Entry (may include power/hydraulic tools when under direct instructor supervision)
- Ventilation (may include power saws when under direct instructor supervision and when secured with fall protection)
- Ropes and Knots (See Rescue for Technical Rope Rescue)
- Ladders (shall include the use of a ladder belt or safety harness for fall prevention)
- Aerial Ladders (shall not exceed 60 degree climbing angle and 75 feet in height. Shall include use of a ladder belt or safety harness for fall prevention.)
- Hose/Nozzles/Appliances (shall not exceed hose line greater than 3")
- Foam (shall not exceed hose line size greater than 3")
- Fire Control (see Live Fire chart below)
- Loss Control (Salvage/Overhaul)
- Emergency Medical Care (shall meet all governing agency requirements)
- Rescue (see Rescue chart below)
- Water Supply
- Sprinklers (Fire Protection Systems and Alarms)
- Hazardous Materials (may only be simulated operations; JRFF shall not be subject to "Live" products or an IDLH)
- Fire Prevention/Public Education
- Building Construction
- Aircraft Crash-Fire-Rescue (see Live Fire chart below)
- Emergency Disaster Planning
- Pump Operations

Live Fire Training	
Structural Firefighting	Fire blast or Pro-Safe Burn Trailers; shall stay outside the burn room; shall be under direct supervision of an SFRT Instructor
Vehicle Firefighting	Fire blast vehicle fire prop only, shall be under direct supervision of an SFRT instructor
Aircraft Firefighting	Fire blast helicopter fire prop only, shall be under direct supervision of an SFRT instructor
Flammable Liquids Firefighting	Shall be SFRT exterior FLAG prop only, under direct supervision of an SFRT instructor
Flammable Gases Firefighting	Shall be SFRT exterior FLAG prop only, under direct supervision of an SFRT instructor
Trash Container/ Rubbish Firefighting	Shall be SFRT prop only, under direct supervision of an SFRT instructor
Wildland Firefighting	No Live Fire Training Permitted

Technical Rescue Training	
Low and High Angle Rope Rescue	Shall be by approved and recognized standards and curricula, shall be under direct supervision of instructor, JRFF shall have a full-body harness and secured with a belay, shall be from a height of no more than 75 feet
Trench Rescue	Shall be under direct supervision of the instructor
Confined Space Rescue	Shall be under direct supervision of the instructor
Collapse Rescue	Shall be under direct supervision of the instructor
Vehicle Extrication and Rescue	Shall be under direct supervision of the instructor
Farm & Machinery Rescue	Shall be under direct supervision of the instructor
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
