

Safety/Athletics/Transportation Report-September 2026

Safety: All state required trainings were conducted within the first full week of school. With all of the trainings, we will fine tune them throughout the year. Our first responders walked the buildings and gave some quality feedback. We had to finetune some evacuation procedures due to wheelchairs being used by students.

All teachers were trained on AED usage. All employees have been working on state required trainings such as active shooter, child abuse, sexual harassment, seizure disorders, FERPA, homeless students, cybersecurity, seclusion and restraints, suicide prevention and bloodborne pathogen training.

We have received three stop tip line requests since the beginning of the school year at the middle/high school. This is an anonymous tip line where students/staff/families can report a situation where they don't feel safe. All three situations were reports of someone feeling as though they were bullied. We have exceeded the number of tips we had all of last year. This is a very valuable tool as we can investigate and prevent a bigger situation.

Each school had their school inspection report that was conducted by the Cabinet for Human Services and each school scored a 100.

Athletics: All fall sports are up and running and participating in games, meets and matches. Our middle school volleyball program has added a 6th grade only team. On August 28, we had our Grandview Night at the high school football game. All Grandview students and staff received t-shirts and each grade was recognized on the field at halftime. On September 4, we had our alumni night. We had over 25 cheer alums come back and cheer on the sidelines for the first half. We also recognized our 1951 state championship team as well as our 1976 state runner-up team. This was the first time most of them had seen the new complex and we heard nothing but positive comments. For the first time in over eight years, we were able to allow the River City Ducks to use our complex for their day of youth football games. We hope this will be a bridge to attract the younger kids back to our district.

Transportation:

Our first routes of the year have started. We are transporting ATC in the afternoon. Once again we have partnered with Dayton and Ft. Thomas to get kids to and from. We have also begun our RSP route. This is a morning and afternoon route. We hired a new part-time van driver to do the afternoon portion.

As school starts back up, in addition to the above mentioned routes, we also have:
