- A. Superintendent Report

Superintendent Thorpe updated the board on several events:

Spoke at a regional HR event; Reviewed district wide survey; Worked with staff on a district-wide set of expectations; Worked with HR on allocations; Visited each school to discuss their survey results; Had virtual meeting with James Comer; Met with MCEA and reviewed their data.

Other information included:

Scheduling a BoE meeting with MCEA (Monday May 12th before the BoE's working session); Kevin Jackson was hired as the new Supervisor of Instruction. Replacing Mr. Chris Mason, who is retiring.; Received a \$70,000 Kentucky Numeracy Counts Grant That provides K-3 Professional Learning; and baseball will be playing in St. Louis May 7th.

- B. Instructional Report
- a. ACT Report

MCHS principal Shannon Solomon introduced teacher John Lloyd Clayton, who does much of the ACT prep with students. Clayton reported that this year, for the first time, we have data for the class of 2026 from two tests, a sophomore/November test and a junior/March test. We showed a composite increase of 2.3 points over the course of these tests of and increases in each subject area. Further, we showed excellent gains in higher level test scores, from 21-25 and 26-36. These gains are important because they qualify students for honors programs, fellowships, and scholarships. Increases in math scores were especially important, and opportunities for growth in reading are goals for next year. We continue to offer weekly ACT study sessions, in-class exercises and activities, and special sessions with ACT Testing Professionals offered a few times per year.

b. Kentucky Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant

Supervisor of Instruction Jackie Reid shared with the board details of the literacy grant the district recently received. The 4 year, \$1.56 million dollar grant will go towards ELA. She says the grant will look at birth to 12th grade in the district, including public and private preschools. One of the main purposes of the grant is to provide science of reading training for administrators and teachers.

Reid did say that because of the uncertainty of federal funding, the grant money is being limited this first year, but she is hopeful the full funding will come through.

C. Attendance/Safety Report

Attendance: DPP Brent Lovett reported that attendance for the past month was at 94.6%, with 5 of the 6 elementary schools over 95%. Central and Sharpe were both around 96%.

Safety: The district Safety Committee will meet on May 6th.

D. Transportation/Facilities Report

Fuel Report – We purchased \$6,067.68 in unleaded fuel and \$19,118.05 in Diesel Fuel this past month.

The repairs that are needed on our current paint machine would be more than what it is worth. So, we started researching what other school districts are doing to get their fields painted. Turf Tank was recommended to us by other school districts in our area. Turf Tank is robotic paint machine. They will program the machine to paint athletic fields and parking lots. It is a three year lease with a cost of \$16,000 a year which includes most of the field paint that will be needed for our seasons. This machine will reduce the amount of man hours needed for painting fields.

Board member Mary Beth Riggs expressed concern over the cost of the machine while considering letting some teachers go.

1. Student Advisory Committee Discussion

Board Chair Darla Doss asked for input from other board members about a presentation from last month's board meeting regarding a possible Student Advisory Committee at the high school. Doss indicated it was something she would like to pursue and possible take action on at the May meeting. All board members agreed.
