In accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Kentucky Administrative Regulations (707 KAR Chapter 1), the district is required to ensure that all students with disabilities are appropriately evaluated and receive a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE). Psychological evaluations and related services are essential components of compliance with these federal and state mandates. Trigg County Schools currently employs one full-time school psychologist; however, the number of evaluations, re-evaluations, and behavioral consultation needs across the district has exceeded the capacity of one provider. Despite ongoing efforts to recruit an additional in-person school

psychologist, no qualified applicants have applied for the position. To ensure timely completion of evaluations, compliance with special education timelines, and continued support for students social-emotional and behavioral needs, the district recommends contracting with Stepping Stones Group to provide virtual school psychology services for a minimum of three days per week. This contracted support will enable the district to maintain compliance with IDEA and 707 KAR Chapter 1 requirements while continuing to seek qualified in-person candidates.

F. Shortened School Day/Shortened School Week Approval

Students with disabilities are expected to attend school for the full school day. However, when circumstances warrant, the Admissions and Release Committee (ARC) may determine that it is in a students best interest to shorten his or her school day. In accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Kentucky Administrative Regulations (707 KAR Chapter 1), local education agencies are required to provide a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) to students with disabilities in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE). The ARC, based on medical documentation and individual student needs, has determined that a shortened school day and/or shortened school week is necessary to ensure FAPE for two studentsone attending Trigg County Primary School and one attending Trigg County Intermediate School. District requirements for granting a shortened school day, including a physicians statement, documented ARC determination, an Individualized Education Program (IEP) prescribing the length of the shortened day, and approval by the Board of Education, have all been met. It is the belief of the ARC that the shortened school day/week is in the best interest of these students. Approval by the Board of Education allows the district to formally implement these ARC decisions while maintaining student confidentiality and ensures the district remains in compliance with state and federal special education regulations. Following Board approval, the district will submit notice to the Kentucky Department of Education/Division of Exceptional Children Services (KDE/DECS). This submission is a procedural notification and not a request for additional approval. In summary, the district requests Board approval of the shortened school day/week for the students identified above to meet their individualized educational and medical needs.
