1. Deco Update: A significant portion of the meeting focused on the ongoing design and development of the new Estill County Middle School. Representatives from the design firm Deco presented a 50% design development update, showcasing architectural renderings and a virtual walkthrough. The design team highlighted significant changes from previous iterations, including the relocation of the main entry and administrative offices to enhance functionality and aesthetics. They also discussed capacity goals and the gym's large seating capacity, emphasizing the flexibility of classroom spaces with removable walls for

collaborative learning. Safety features, such as bullet-resistant windows and a secure design, were also ensured.

VI. Superintendent's Report

A. Update

Superintendent Brock provided a detailed update on the middle school's funding and construction status. While \$5 million had been allocated and spent on design and site development, the full funding package of approximately \$16 million was pending official legislative approval, potentially in a special session this fall. The superintendent clarified misconceptions about the use of funds, emphasizing that \$5 million is insufficient to relocate students or begin site preparation, which costs over \$7 million. He reassured stakeholders of the current building's safety, with continuous structural monitoring and engineering assessments ensuring no immediate danger to students.

The board also discussed compliance with Senate Bill 181, which regulates electronic communication between school employees and students. Parents must complete in-person waivers for any communication exemptions to ensure legal compliance and protect student privacy. The district has approved specific communication apps for clubs and sports to maintain compliance.

Peggy Baca

Q: There are many concerns for safety among the students, staff, and parents. Safety concerns were used to justify the request for \$38 million (which jumped to \$52 million) in funding from the state. Those safety concerns didn't disappear simply because the full funding wasn't approved. So what are you doing to address those safety issues directly? 2. What happened to the 5 million dollars that were earmarked for moving students to keep them safe, and why aren't they being moved?

Q: This question will probably be answered before the public comments session. When will the excavation for the middle school begin, and what are the future plans for the current middle school lot?
