In conformity with KRS 15.257, the Office of the Attorney General has updated "Open Records Open Meetings Guide" to reflect recent changes to the Open Records and Open Meetings Acts. The Office of the Attorney General also distributes Managing Government Records: A Cooperative Undertaking. Under KRS 160.395, superintendents of public school districts must deliver these publications to each elected school board member and each school based decision making council member. These materials must be distributed within 60 days of receipt or within 60 days of the day newly elected or appointed officials or members take office. Superintendents must require and maintain signatory proof that each

school board member and school council member has received these materials House Bill 312 amends multiple areas of KRS Chapter 61 by changing the process and format for parties requesting open records of public agencies. Agencies cannot require a particular form although they must accept the records request form created for use by the Office of the Attorney General.
