- Rob Hartman, WVES The elementary school has had a great start to the year. One of the new security measures for the first day of classes was the "fast pass" system. Each child's family was mailed a unique "fast pass" to use rather than the traditional check-in process. Mr. Hartman thanked all of those adults who came to help with first day foot traffic.
- Eric Morwessel, WVMS 93 5th grade students attended Camp Bearcat. There was a very successful open house event last week. On October 1st, there will be a social media security presentation during the school day for middle school students and in the evening for any parents in the district.
- Joanne Nesmith, WVHS Our dual enrollment program continues to be a great addition to our course offerings. For the current school year, 116 high school students are enrolled in 255 dual credit courses through Northern Kentucky University, Gateway Community and Technical College, Murray State University, and Kentucky State University.



Walton-Verona Elementary School Council Report for Board of Education 8-30-18

- School is off to a great start. Our classes are full and everyone seems to be settling in. We've had a few new students with us this year but most of that number comes from adding another kindergarten class. Thanks goes out to all our grade levels for their participation and hard work in preparing for open house nights and the first day of school. Thanks also goes out to our PTA, board members and retired employees for their help on the first days of school helping kids find classes and directing parents.
- Students are busy taking their beginning of year MAP tests currently. As you know, this is done 3 times a year and we'll use this data to compare to last year but also in planning for this year. Our IOWA test data is also in and our 2nd and 3rd grade teachers have had access to it. It was useful for our 3rd grade teachers to get a better idea of where most of their students stand in reading and math. We hope to take the IOWA again this coming spring at KPREP time.
- PBIS (positive behavior intervention) team is back together this month looking at staff self-assessment data. This is how we determine level of success and what changes need to be made within our PBI system. At this point in the year, the teachers are reinforcing rules and procedures having to do with that Positive Behavior Intervention System (such as procedures in hallways, cafeteria and classroom). We have also done school wide PBIS lesson on school busses. To date, we've had 3 office referral for discipline (all from bus).
- WVES is busy with its work in conjunction with Mrs. Gregg who is applying for a Youth Service
 Center Grant. We have had 2 advisory team meeting and have been reaching out to local
 businesses for pledges of support (either in good, services or monetary) should we receive the grant.
 The grant is designed to help schools help families reduce barriers to learning or access to school.
 It is also intended to be an educational resource for families to get what they need when they need it.
- We had one small construction project this summer. We divided Kate McCay's office in half to
 make room for our new permanent SRO, Amy Schworer. She has been a great addition to our staff
 and helped immensely, already, in the area of school culture.
- Our next large-scale event will be our WVES-PTA Fall Festival set to happen on Sept 21 from 5-8:30 pm. This is always a huge hit with our little ones and families. Our PTA does a fantastic job in coordinating rides and games and helping to set up and tear down.
