Walton-Verona Elementary School Council Report for Board of Education 9-27-18

WVES is wrapping up a great 1st Full-Month" of school! Our young Bearcats are doing a terrific job learning and being immersed in our culture of "The Big 3" (Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Ready to Learn). Our PBIS team looked at behavior trends and made school-wide recommendations on this on 9/24/18 as part of a monthly team meeting.

We have hosted 2 major school events this month; Our Camp-Read-A-Lot A.R. Night was held on 9/11/18. We used survey data to change our layout and logistics a little bit. The new format seemed to work much better and be less clustered into one or two areas. Our other school event was our Fall Festival which occurred on 9/21/18. In spite of a bleak weather forecast, things went well even though most of the attractions were moved indoors. With the help and advice of new SRO, Amy Schrower, we were able to minimize parking issues which have long plagued this event. A few commented they actually preferred the "all indoor" Fall Festival.

Teachers got a look at KPREP Data and we were all thrilled with our progress compared to last couple of years. Teachers also trained on new system which includes the various levels of "support and improvement" from our state. We were very grateful and feel blessed to be "other." We know that comes from hard work and staying true to our core belief that kids come first. We also compared last fall's MAP data to this fall's MAP data. In all grades but one, the scores show and improvement in both reading and math at this point in the school year. In other words they are all starting out a little ahead of where they were at this point in 2017 (which is tremendous). We did this on Early Release Day 9/20/18.

SBDM Council meeting for September mainly comprised of policy and by-law editing. Our team looked at our preliminary MAP data for the Fall and approved our current budget.

Mr. Patterson and Mr. Hartman are currently busy working on observations, classroom walk-throughs and discussing their professional growth plans with teachers.

Our newThreat Assessment team met September 10th to establish group roles, purpose, future meeting dates and goals for next meeting. This team was an outcome of our training this summer put on by Whalen Security.

Kentucky Kids Day (9/25/18) – Dr. Baker was our "Mystery Reader" of a story on a pre-recorded video sent to all classrooms. Kids had to guess who the reader was. Our PTA also had an assembly for all kids preK-4. We also combined it with a spirit wear day.






WVHS School Board Report September 2018

Walton-Verona High School was recognized as WKRC's Duke Energy School of the Week! The school was awarded with a \$1,000 check from Duke Energy. The award resulted from the nomination of Tracy Bazsika who referenced the efforts of our SAFE Agent and the manner in which students are greeted every morning. She commented on the connection our staff has with their students and the resources provided to our kids. The award monies will be shared between Project Prom and Wake-Up Walton.

On Wednesday, September 19th, Sarah Hester hosted a KHEAA presentation for parents of juniors and seniors. The session covered information regarding paying for college including, scholarships, grants, and filling out the FAFSA. Approximately twenty-five parents were in attendance. A follow up session will be offered to all seniors and their parents on Wednesday, October 3rd. The title of this workshop is "FAFSA Completion Workshop." The goal of this workshop is for all families to complete and submit their FAFSA application before leaving the computer lab.

On Friday, September 21st WVHS hosted The Academic and Attendance Award Ceremony. Students were recognized on overall GPA standing upon conclusion of the 2017-18 school year. Students with perfect attendance during the 2017-18 school year were also recognized. One-hundred and seventy-five sophomores, juniors and seniors were invited to this award ceremony. This represents 43% of those classes who were recognized for either academics or perfect attendance. Eighteen students were recognized for perfect attendance for the entire school year, and of that group, thirteen also received an Academic letter. Seniors in the Class of 2018 were awarded their Academic letters or Academic chevrons at graduation practice.

All seniors who have not met benchmarks on the ACT have met one-on-one with either Mrs. Hester or Mrs. Nesmith. Interested students are participating in seminar extensions in either English or Reading. The math department will be offering targeted boot camps for these seniors who register for either the October or December ACT. All students who meet benchmark due to their October or December ACT scores will have the opportunity to adjust their second semester schedule for those courses in which they reach benchmark.
