- Elementary principal Rob Hartman shared information about kindergarten readiness trends for the past 6 years, and gap group data, which shows an improvement in all areas from 16-17 to 17-18. 4<sup>th</sup> grader Wyatt S was the regional cross country champion.



Walton-Verona Elementary School Council Report for Board of Education 10-25-18

This week is KY Safe Schools Week. Each day our kids hear a positive anti-bullying message (superhero theme) as well as in-class lessons from counselor. This is on the heels of a school wide assembly put on by the Power Team with a similar message (Oct 11).

Our new Threat Assessment team met Oct 8 (meeting number 2) to approve flow chart for handling threats made by children. Team consists of psychologist, principals, counselor, SRO, SAFE Agent, and teacher. This team was an outcome of our training this summer put on by Whalen Security.

WVES put together a School Safety Team in addition to our Threat Assessment Team. The School Safety team's job is to analyze any school security issues and to review drill procedures and other safety related items. Group met on Oct 11 and plan to meet monthly until all procedures have been reviewed. After that, the plan is to meet quarterly. This team consists of SRO, custodian, principal, counselor, teachers from all grades, front office secretary and a teacher aide.

Next week (week of the 29<sup>th</sup>) begins our Red Ribbon Week. Each day will consist of a positive announcement around being Drug-Free and dress up theme. We will also be tying in Scholastic Book Fair and Halloween AR Night which is traditionally our largest attended evening event. Also being revived this year is a "Shop with your Grandparent" event after school on Nov 1 where Grandparents can have a special time set aside for Book Fair Shopping (with their grandchildren).

Veterans' Day celebration is scheduled for November 12<sup>th</sup> starting at 9:15 for WVES with presenter David Hincks ret. Air Force. We will have 2 presentations at 9:15 for our younger students and 9:40 for our older ones. We have had David in the past and he has always done a terrific job relating Veterans' Day to our students. We are also creating and sending cards from every student to send to a veteran who will be on one of the Honor Flights later this year.

The week of October 8<sup>th</sup> our K-4 teachers were involved in our first round of RTI data meetings where we discuss individual students and progress toward goals. Unbelievably Winter MAP is right around the corner so we will be discussing these goals with students very soon. Students are self tracking their progress this year in all classes.






#### Walton-Verona High School School Board Report October 2018

The 2018 Homecoming Dance was a huge success! Approximately 400 students were in attendance and Brodnick Hall at St. Timothy's Church accommodated our crowd nicely. We are already looking at adjustments with the layout for the kids if we are able to return there next year. We are welcome to return, it will just be a question of hall availability once the Homecoming date is determined.

We have earned the category of "Other" with the results of the 2017-18 state testing assessments. The high school was ranked based on Proficiency, Gap Group, Transition Readiness and Graduation Rate. The juniors' performance on the ACT given in March and their performance on the On-Demand Writing in May gave us our "Proficiency" score; The Gap Group consists of the academic performance of our free/reduced lunch population and special education students; Transition Readiness is the new name for "College and Career Readiness" and is a score earned by our seniors; and Graduation Rate represents the number of students of our senior class who started high school in August of 2014 and successfully graduated with their class in 2018. A new component was added to this piece this year, also generating a statistic for a five year graduate. That would include a student who started high school in August of 2013 and successfully graduated in five years, with the Class of 2018. Our students and our teachers continue to deliver at high marks of academic excellence.

We have come across another career opportunity for our kids. After attending an informational session on Supply Chains in our area hosted by the Chamber of Commerce, we are establishing a partnership with Kroger (their new warehouse on Toebben Drive) and UPS their newer facility in Richwood.) Students will have the opportunity to work for an excellent wage, earn tuition incentives and be promoted within their companies while going to school or working full time. An informational session for students and families is set for Thursday, November 15th at 8:00 a.m. in the Multi-Purpose Room. Students will view a video on the Supply Chain Industry and opportunities prior to the meeting to generate interest. Christy Otten and Sarah Hester will also be reaching out to students who may be good candidates for this opportunity based on information from the junior lunches last year.








WVHS School Board Report September 2018

Walton-Verona High School was recognized as WKRC's Duke Energy School of the Week! The school was awarded with a \$1,000 check from Duke Energy. The award resulted from the nomination of Tracy Bazsika who referenced the efforts of our SAFE Agent and the manner in which students are greeted every morning. She commented on the connection our staff has with their students and the resources provided to our kids. The award monies will be shared between Project Prom and Wake-Up Walton.

On Wednesday, September 19th, Sarah Hester hosted a KHEAA presentation for parents of juniors and seniors. The session covered information regarding paying for college including, scholarships, grants, and filling out the FAFSA. Approximately twenty-five parents were in attendance. A follow up session will be offered to all seniors and their parents on Wednesday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>. The title of this workshop is "FAFSA Completion Workshop." The goal of this workshop is for all families to complete and submit their FAFSA application before leaving the computer lab.

On Friday, September 21st WVHS hosted The Academic and Attendance Award Ceremony. Students were recognized on overall GPA standing upon conclusion of the 2017-18 school year. Students with perfect attendance during the 2017-18 school year were also recognized. One-hundred and seventy-five sophomores, juniors and seniors were invited to this award ceremony. This represents 43% of those classes who were recognized for either academics or perfect attendance. Eighteen students were recognized for perfect attendance for the entire school year, and of that group, thirteen also received an Academic letter. Seniors in the Class of 2018 were awarded their Academic letters or Academic chevrons at graduation practice.

All seniors who have not met benchmarks on the ACT have met one-on-one with either Mrs. Hester or Mrs. Nesmith. Interested students are participating in seminar extensions in either English or Reading. The math department will be offering targeted boot camps for these seniors who register for either the October or December ACT. All students who meet benchmark due to their October or December ACT scores will have the opportunity to adjust their second semester schedule for those courses in which they reach benchmark.


