For the past several years they keep track of students who were enrolled in post-secondary schools before they graduated high school but never ended up attending college. In 2014-2015 the summer melt rate was at 62.04%. In 2018 the summer melt percentage drastically dropped to 25.00%. Mr. Hornblower attributes that to the mentoring partnership they implemented to connect students with a mentor to keep them on track through the summer up to 12 months after high school.
