The superintendent supports and builds a system committed to shared values and beliefs focused on teaching and learning where performance gaps are systematically eliminated over time and each student graduates from high school college-and-career ready.

1. <u>Leads the district's philosophy of education-setting specific achievement targets for schools and students of all ability levels and monitors progress toward those targets.</u>

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- 1. Examples are expectation discussions and communications with schools and team. Learning needs identified through data to close any gaps utilizing the multi-tiered system of supports, extended school services and daytime tutoring as well as protection of instructional time within the school day. Another example is my visits first semester to over 100 classrooms and some within each school and the virtual academy to get a snapshot of teaching and learning.
- 1. <u>Models and applies learning for staff and students. Uses evaluation and PD as tools to improve student learning and evaluates PD activities.</u>
- 1. As part of the revision process of the district and school improvement plans the professional learning and development activities are evaluated and linked to the needs identified to help accomplish the goals outlined within the plan.
- **D.** Facilitates the establishment of high, academic goals for all, ensures effective monitoring protocols, and models the expectation that instructional leaders respond frequently and strategically to progress data.
  - 1. The district team and school teams have been strategically planning within their improvement plans. The district team has been developing effective monitoring protocols through a 30/60/90 day process.

The district instructional team has developed a school monitoring schedule for visits by many of us to each school to get a look at teaching and learning so we can best support our teachers and schools.
