Kim ChevalierWe are working to expand this committee using new format and set rules/bylaws. She welcomed Kevin Brown and recognized him for his work as Interim State Education Commissioner.
Reorganization of the ECE Department	John Roberts Mr. Roberts reviewed the 5 ECE Zones, which align with the district zones and their structure. The redesign of ECE allows for more structured multi-level support. • Zones • Elementary Zones 1 - 3 • Middle • High Angelique SchererThe new design aligns with the JCPS structure making it easier to collaborate with Regular Education groups, which allows for an increased level of support. Kim ChevalierThe Leadership group meets every Friday to work on the ECE action plan which mirrors Dr. Pollio's vision for the District. The Anchors of the ECE Action Plan are: • Identification and Compliance • Communication and Collaboration • Professional Learning • Student Support and Related Services • Financial Management

Virtual Learning	Kim ChevalierMs. Chevalier gave shout-outs to those providing supports and services on all district levels during NTI. Parent involvement is a large piece of NTI. The District is working on providing mental health support to students and families. The ECE Department has a team working on guidance regarding compensatory education services to meet student needs. Rashawna MullaneyMs. Mullaney reported that the District is still responsible to conduct ARC meetings. ECE has placed a large focus on keeping up with student assessments. The department has witnessed more parental participation with virtual meetings, as they take less time and parents can join from home and work.

	Catherine SherrardHer child attends a JCPS high school and although NTI has been challenging, they are succeeding. She is concerned about her child backsliding. Ms. Sherrard is looking forward to hearing about more opportunities for students 18-21 years old.
	Steve NobleThe LDA continues to support children the best they can despite the struggles of COVID. They have plans to put together virtual sessions to provide support for parents. They are working on education learning Apps and early elementary learning games. Students from KY helped test these programs remotely. 	Ginevra CourtadeDr. Courtade thanked JCPS for continuing to host student teachers. U of L is working on LBD teacher strands and launching an Alternate Certification program for LBD. They continue to work on creating pathways for teachers.
	Mike MillerThe KATC is working with transitional families, launching an independent living program at WKU, and a driving training program for students with a learners permit. They are working with the Vocational Rehab program, building parent support groups, and conducting virtual training. Future Tonics:	Susan TeafordDSL is working on creating resources to support teachers and families. They provided NTI support for small groups and provided 1 to 1 services to students until a recent temporary shut down. She is concerned about NTI struggles for the kindergarten and 1st grade children, as well as their computer exposure. She would like to see more colleges and universities open programs and offer pathways for learning. • Transition Resources for Students with Down Syndrome Roberta Alstontechnical difficulties Bob NapolilliCouncil on Developmental Disabilities (not present) Mr. Napolilli shared that the Council continues to provide supports virtually. They still provide L.E.A.D. (Leadership Education & Advocacy Development) training, are developing an IEP Advocacy program to consult with families on IEP development, and are focused on transition and collaboration. They have a resource center on their website. Kim ChevalierECE is actively working on the expansion of transition services. The goal is to find more options to increase community partners for external opportunities. ECE has added more job trainer positions in its structure. Transition services rely heavily on community support.
